

ORDINANCE 116242

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AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Criminal Code, providing for the continued validity of prosecutions for unlawful conduct under Ordinance 115171 concerning drug traffic loitering notwithstanding the expiration or repeal of that ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The expiration or repeal of Ordinance 115171 shall not affect the validity of any prosecution under that ordinance for unlawful conduct committed prior to the date of the expiration or repeal of that ordinance, and such prosecution may proceed as though Ordinance 115171 had remained in effect.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section.....2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
