1 AN ORDINANCE amending Seattle Municipal Code 6.08.010, 6.36.020, 6.42.030,
2 6.48.020, 6.82.140, 6.102.030 and 6.204.120 to increase certain regulatory

3 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

4 Section 1. As of January 1, 1993, Seattle Municipal Code, Section 6.08.010 (Ordinance
5 48022, Section 3051 as last amended by Ordinance 113185, Section 1 (part)) is further
amended as follows:

6 6.08.010 License required.

7 ((As of January 1, 1973,)) ((it shall be)) It is unlawful for any person to engage in, or to
8 represent himself or herself as being engaged in, the business of selling, leasing, renting,
9 servicing, inspecting, installing, maintaining, or repairing alarms or alarm systems for
10 the purposes of preventing or detecting burglaries or robberies without complying with
11 the provisions of this chapter and without first obtaining a valid and subsisting license so
12 to do to be known as a "burglar alarm dealer's license," the fee for which shall be
13 ((Thirty Dollars (\$30.00))) Sixty-five Dollars (\$65.00) per year; provided that such
14 license shall not be required of any person for the purpose of installing wires or
15 equipment to convey electric current, or installing apparatus or appliances to be operated
16 by such current and who is required by the laws of the state to have a license to engage
17 in, conduct or carry on the business of installing such wires, equipment, apparatus, or
18 appliances.

19 Section 2. As of January 1, 1993, Sub-Section B of Seattle Municipal code Section
20 6.36.020 (Ordinance 48022, Section 172 (part) as last amended by Ordinance 114207,
Section 2 (part)) is further amended as follows:

21 B. The fee for a reducing salon or public bathhouse license is ((Two Hundred
22 Forty Dollars (\$240.00))) Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) per year; the fee for a massage
23 premises license is Eighty dollars (\$80.00) per year.

24 Section 3. As of January 1, 1993, Seattle Municipal Code Section 6.42.030 (Ordinance
25 48022, Section 330.2 as last amended by Ordinance 114895, Section 5) is further

6.42.030 License fees.

The license year shall be from January 1st to December 31st. All license fees shall be payable on an annual basis, ~~((except as hereinafter provided, which))~~ ~~((fees))~~ Fees shall be as follows:

A. Panoram location license ~~((Thirty Dollars \$30.00))~~ Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00) per year for each location;

B. Panoram device license ~~((Thirty Dollars (\$30.00))~~ Thirty-five (\$35.00) per year for each device.

Section 4. As of January 1, 1993, Seattle Municipal Code Section 6.48.020 (Ordinance 48022 Section 147 as last amended by Ordinance 113185, Section 1 (part)) is further amended as follows:

6.48.020 License required-Fee.

It is unlawful for any person to own, operate, or maintain a public garage or parking lot without first having obtained a license to do so. The fee for such license is hereby fixed at the rate of ~~((Thirty Dollars (\$30.00))~~ Forty Dollars (\$40.00) per year for each one thousand (1,000) square feet of floor or ground space contained in such parking garage or parking lot and used for parking or storage purposes.

Section 5. As of January 1, 1993, Seattle Municipal Code Section 6.82.140 (Ordinance 84297,

Section 13 as last amended by Ordinance 114245, Section 3) is further amended as follows:

6.82.140 License and examination fees.

C. A separate license shall be required for each separate place of business of a refrigeration service shop, refrigeration contractor, or air-conditioning contractor.

Section 6. As of January 1, 1993, Seattle Municipal Code Section 6.102.030 (Ordinance 110888, Section 1 as last amended by Ordinance 113185, Section 1 (part)) is further amended as follows:

6.102.030 License fee.

License fees shall be annual and licenses may be renewed upon payment of the annual fee.

1 The annual fee for a tattoo shop license shall be (~~Three Hundred Fifty-five Dollars~~
2 ~~(\$355.00))~~ Four Hundred Sixty-five Dollars (\$465.00). All licenses shall expire on
3 February 28th but where application for license is made less than six (6) months before
4 such date of expiration the amount of the fee shall be one-half (1/2) of the annual fee.
5 The tattoo shop license shall designate the place of operation and may be transferred to a
6 new location upon payment of ten percent (10%) of the annual fee. No license shall be
7 issued under this chapter to any person under eighteen (18) year of age. It shall be
8 unlawful to practice as a tattoo operator except in a licensed tattoo shop.

9 Section 7. As of January 1, 1993, Seattle Municipal Code, 6.204.120, (Ordinance
10 115948, as last amended by ordinance 115531, Section 2) is further amended as follows:

11 6.204.120 Tobacco product retailing.

12 A. The annual fee for issuance of a tobacco product retailer's license shall be
13 (~~One Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$125.00))~~ One Hundred Thirty-five Dollars
14 (\$135.00), per location, motor vehicle or operation.

15 B. The fee for reissuance of a license upon a change in a licensed tobacco
16 product retailer's motor vehicle route shall be Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

SUBJECT: PROPOSED CHANGES FOR CERTAIN REGULATORY LICENSE FEES

The enclosed ordinances propose changes in certain regulatory license fees.

The attached schedule, "Proposed New Regulatory License Fees", lists those certain regulatory licenses administered by the City, the last year the fee for the license was set, the present annual license fee, the proposed new fee, the number of licenses presently active, the amount of revenue that would accrue in 1993 if the fee were not changed, and the amount of revenue that would accrue to the City if the new fee were adopted.

It should be noted that the list contains only those regulatory licenses for which a fee change is proposed.

It should also be noted that the business license fee is not listed on the attached schedule although changes are being proposed for that fee. Proposed adjustments to the business license fee are contained in separate ordinances.

The proposed new fees were developed by adjusting the current fee by the amount of inflation, as measured by the Local Consumer Price Index, that has occurred since the fee was last set. The attached schedule notes the year the fee was last set.
