

SUBJECT: Legislation to Adopt New Mission Statement

The attached legislation would amend the Seattle Municipal Code to incorporate the new Mission Statement of the Department of Housing and Human Services. This new Mission Statement reflecting the 1992 Departmental reorganization, was derived from the planning efforts culminating in the Department's Kaleidoscope 1993-1996 plan. In briefing the City Council's Housing, Health, Human Services and Education Committee on the plan, Committee members requested that the Department's new Mission Statement be formally adopted.

The Kaleidoscope plan was developed through an extensive year-long process involving Department staff, members of the Executive, City Councilmembers, other departments and the community. The Kaleidoscope plan includes the Department's vision, values, mission and six goals and describes all Department objectives for the period 1993 through 1996. The Kaleidoscope plan integrates a number of planning efforts that address particular segments of the community served by the Department.

To ensure a solid foundation for the plan, the Department developed a vision statement which outlines what the Department plans to work to achieve over the next 20 years--a caring community for people to live, learn, work and participate. A statement of Department values was developed to guide how this vision would be achieved. The new Mission Statement succinctly captures the role of the new Department of Housing and Human Services. We look forward to our role in helping the city to achieve the best possible future.

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Department of Housing and Human Services, amending Seattle Municipal Code Section 3.20.010 to adopt a new Mission Statement of the Department of Housing and Human Services.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code Section 3.20.010 as last amended by Ordinance 115958, is amended to read as follows:

Department created--Purpose.

A. There is created a Department of Housing and Human Services for the development of comprehensive housing, housing-related services, human services and education policies and plans; to act as coordinator and advocate for social and housing needs and concerns of the City's population; and for the administration, coordination, planning and operation of City programs and functions relating to human problems and needs, including ((specifically)) without limitation those of persons who are aged, youth, disabled, veterans, unemployed and underemployed, homeless, low-income, have special needs or are otherwise disadvantaged.

B. The mission of the Department of Housing and Human Services is to strengthen the ability of all people in the Seattle metropolitan area to live, learn, work and participate in safe, strong, and caring communities.

C. The Department seeks to enhance the quality of life and promote self-reliance, growth, and development of people. To these ends, the Department will strive to provide resources and services, to remove barriers to meeting human needs, and to improve public policies.

D. The intent of this Section is to state generally the mission and activities of the Department. This Section shall not be construed to create, establish or designate any particular class or group of persons who will or should be especially protected or benefitted, nor to create any entitlement to any benefits or services.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.
