1 AN ORDINANCE relating to the Office of Management and Planning
2 authorizing the Director of the Office of Management and Planning to execute a

9 WHEREAS, the City Council and Mayor in Resolution 28619 identified the
10 preservation and protection of Seattle's urban forest as an Environmental
11 Priority; and

12 WHEREAS, the Office of Management and Planning chairs the City's Urban Forest
13 Coalition which consists of the Department of Neighborhoods, Seattle City
14 Light, the Department of Construction and Land Use, the Seattle Engineering
15 Department, and the Department of Parks and Recreation, and other related
16 City of Seattle programs and activities, and whose mission is to integrate
17 overlapping urban forest responsibilities and provide seamless public services;
18 and

19 WHEREAS, the Urban Forest Coalition submitted, via Resolution 29324, an
20 application to the National Urban and Community Forestry Advisory
21 Council's 1996 Challenge Cost-Share Grant Program for federal financial
22 assistance for the purpose of developing public information, education, and
23 activity tools about Seattle's urban forests.

24 WHEREAS, the Urban Forest Coalition's application for its "A City Among the
25 Trees" proposal was accepted to receive a federal assistance award for its
26 implementation; NOW, THEREFORE,

27 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

28 Section 1. As requested by the Director of the Office of Management and
Planning, the Director of the Office of Management and Planning is hereby
authorized to execute for and on the behalf of The City of Seattle a grant agreement
with the National Urban and Community Forestry Advisory Council and to accept
funds in the approximate amount of Seventy-two Thousand and Seventy-five Dollars
(\$72,075) for a Public Involvement and Education project to develop a multi-media
urban forest program. The funds when received shall be deposited into the General
Fund.

Section 2. To implement the federal grant contemplated by this ordinance and contingent on execution of the agreement authorized in Section 1, the following expenditure allowance in the object of expenditure designated below in the 1996 City budget for the Office of Management and Planning is hereby increased as follows:

Program Category	Expenditures Charges	Amount
X8M	Other Charges	\$72,075

and for such purpose, Seventy-two Thousand and Seventy-five Dollars (\$72,075) is hereby appropriated to the appropriate expenditure account in the General Fund to be reimbursed from grant funds received.

Section 3. The Director of the Office of Management and Planning is authorized to hire expert consultant services as may be necessary for the grant-assisted project, including the procurement of project management and video and/or multi-media programming services.

Section 4. Any monies received under this grant agreement which shall be unexpended in 1996 and 1997 shall be carried over into subsequent budget years.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020

Dear Council President Drago,

We request City Council adoption of the enclosed ordinance. This ordinance authorizes the Director of the Office of Management and Planning to execute a grant agreement with the National Urban and Community Forestry Advisory Council (NUCFAC) to develop public information, education and activity tools about Seattle's urban forest and accepts federal assistance funds of \$72,075.

BACKGROUND AND PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City Council adopted Resolution 29324 on April 8, 1996, authorizing the Director of the Office of Management and Planning to apply to the NUCFAC 1996 Challenge Cost-Share Grant Program for financial assistance to develop public information and education and materials and activity tools about Seattle's urban forests. NUCFAC informed us on July 3, 1996, that we had been selected to receive a \$72,075 grant to develop "A City Among the Trees," a video project with an accompanying planning workbook and educator's guidebook.

These three products will be used by local planners, developers, policymakers and people active in their neighborhoods to create awareness and know-how for developing and caring for our urban forests. They will also be distributed to schools and used by educators to plan and develop educational activities that embrace the universal ethic of environmental stewardship.

The grant requires a local match, which will be met through the existing staff resources OMP and the City's Urban Forest Coalition, which includes personnel from OMP, the Department of Neighborhoods, Seattle City Light, the Department of Construction and Land Use, the Seattle Engineering Department, and the Department of Parks and Recreation. The following twelve local organizations and community groups have also pledged resources in the form of time and supplies:



A consultant that specializes in multimedia will be hired to actually develop the video and workbook and potentially manage the project.

The proposed ordinance authorizes receipt of \$72,075 in Federal grant reimbursements for the "A City Among the Trees" project. The three-product project and its promotion and dissemination is expected to be completed at yearend 1998.
