12 L. There shall be an Executive Director, who shall be appointed to an initial term of three (3) years, and
13 who may be reappointed thereafter for subsequent three-year terms. The Commission shall appoint the
14 Executive Director, subject to confirmation by the City Council. The Executive Director may serve
15 pending Confirmation by the Council. The position of Executive Director shall be exempt from the
16 classified civil service.

17 B. In case of a vacancy, the Commission may appoint an interim Executive Director for a period not to
18 exceed 120 days from the date of appointment. The Commission shall present an Executive Director
19 candidate for confirmation to the City Council before the end of the interim appointment.
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

Section 1. Section 4.04.250 of the Seattle Municipal Code is amended by adding a new Subsection thereto as follows:

4.04.250 Civil Service Commission

L. There shall be an Executive Director, who shall be appointed to an initial term of three (3) years, and who may be reappointed thereafter for subsequent three-year terms. The Commission shall appoint the Executive Director, subject to confirmation by the City Council. The Executive Director may serve pending Confirmation by the Council. The position of Executive Director shall be exempt from the classified civil service.

B. In case of a vacancy, the Commission may appoint an interim Executive Director for a period not to exceed 120 days from the date of appointment. The Commission shall present an Executive Director candidate for confirmation to the City Council before the end of the interim appointment.
