ORDINANCE 121817

AN ORDINANCE relating to City employment, to be known as the First Quarter 2005 Salary Ordinance, designating two positions as exempt from Civil Service status; all by a 2/3 vote of the City Council.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Designating Two Positions as Exempt from Civil Service Status. As recommended by the Personnel Director in the Classification Determination specified, two positions are designated as exempt from Civil Service as noted below:

- 1 position (#00026691) in the Executive Department – Office of Economic Development; Senior Planner designated to Strategic Advisor 2, Exempt (Report #04-7902).
- 1 position (#00010376) in the Legislative Department; Administrative Specialist II designated to Administrative Staff Assistant (Report #05-7949).

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Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

I am transmitting the attached proposed Council Bill that comprises the First Quarter 2005 Salary Ordinance, containing classification actions that require legislative approval pursuant to Council Resolution 30046 and City Charter Article XVI, Section 3.

As a result of a classification review, the Personnel Director determined that one City position should be redesignated to Strategic Advisor 2, Exempt, one should be redesignated to Administrative Staff Assistant, and both should continue to be exempted from the classified service. This latter action requires approval by two-thirds of the City Council.
