AN ORDINANCE authorizing, in 2010, acceptance of funding from non-City sources; authorizing the heads of the Office for Education, the Office of Housing, the Seattle Fire Department, the Office for Civil Rights, the Human Services Department, the Department of Planning and Development, the Seattle Police Department, and Seattle Public Utilities to accept specified grants and private funding and to execute, deliver, and perform corresponding agreements.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Director of the Office for Education, the Director of the Office of Housing, the Fire Chief, the Director of the Office for Civil Rights, the Director of Human Services, the Director of Planning and Development, the Chief of Police, and the Director of Seattle Public Utilities are authorized to accept the following non-City funding from the grantors listed below, and to execute, deliver, and perform on behalf of the City of Seattle, agreements for the purposes described below. The funds, when received, shall be deposited in the receiving fund identified below to support, or as reimbursement for, the corresponding appropriations set forth in the ordinance introduced as C.B. 116969.



Section 1 – Grants Which Need Appropriation Increases		
1.1	<p>Grant from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (Educational and Developmental Services Levy - Educational & Developmental Services Fund - 17856)</p> <p>This action increases the 2010 Families and Education Levy's Administration and Evaluation budget by \$30,000. The grant funding, which runs from May 5 through November 15, 2010, will be used to fund the planning and implementation activities for a conference to be held in Seattle in the fall of 2010. The conference will focus on sharing information among six to eight cities and counties in the U.S. that provide major, ongoing public funding to support and supplement education in their jurisdictions.</p>	\$30,000
1.2	<p>HOME Appropriation Adjustment (Office of Housing - Low-Income Housing Fund - 16400)</p> <p>This item increases support to the Low Income Housing Fund by \$692,696 from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) HOME Program. The additional HOME monies are unexpended funds from 1996 through 1998 fiscal years, recently identified by HUD as available to the City. The grant may be drawn immediately from the U.S. Treasury for eligible projects consistent with HOME regulations, primarily for Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDO). These additional grant funds do not include an administrative allowance and support no existing or new positions.</p>	\$692,696



1.3	<p>Firefighter Turnout Suits. (Seattle Fire Department - General Subfund - 00100)</p> <p>This item increases support to the Operations BCL by \$625,504 from FEMA in the Federal Department of Homeland Security. The grant funds will be used to replace worn and less safe bunking gear that is currently in service and has been for over ten years. These issued items have been inspected and are in immediate need of replacement. Advances in material and manufacturing over the last decade make the gear currently in use obsolete. Materials used in newer gear are more flame retardant, blocks blood born pathogens, provides a safer moisture barrier and includes a safety harness to help extract fallen firefighters. This grant has been a year in the works and at the time of the grant request, the current gear was ready to be retired. The additional year of wear and tear this gear has received makes the purchase of new items even more pressing. There are no positions associated with this grant and the twenty per cent local match of \$156,376 is available from existing budget specified for bunking gear replacement. SFD appropriates grant funds supporting any BCL to F6000 for centralized grant and financial management.</p>	\$625,504
1.4	<p>HUD Housing Case Processing (Seattle Office for Civil Rights - General Subfund - 00100)</p> <p>This item increases support to the Enforcement Division of the Seattle Office for Civil Rights by \$172,051 in grant funding through the US Department of Housing and urban Development (HUD). This grant provides funding to the department to investigate complaints in HUD housing cases during the review period of October 1, 2008 to September 30, 2009. The amount of this grant varies from year to year based on the numbers of cases processed during HUD's review period. HUD does not require a match of city funds for this grant.</p>	\$172,051
1.5	<p>EEOC Employment Case Processing (Seattle Office for Civil Rights - General Subfund - 00100)</p>	\$40,900



	<p>This item increases support to the Enforcement Division of the Seattle Office for Civil Rights by \$40,900 in grant funding through the US Equal Employment Opportunity commission (EEOC). This grant provides funding to the department to investigate complaints in EEOC employment cases during the review period of October 1, 2008 to September 30, 2009. The amount of this grant varies from year to year based on the numbers of cases processed during EEOC's review period. EEOC does not require a match of city funds for this grant.</p>	
1.6	<p>FY 09 State Homeland Security Program Grant Activities (Seattle Police Department - General Subfund - 00100)</p> <p>This item increases support to the Chief of Police program in the Seattle Police Department by \$1,119,805 from the King County Office of Emergency Management under the FY 09 State Homeland Security Program pass-through grant. This funding will provide support for separate program activities, each of which will strengthen the readiness of law enforcement personnel to deter and respond effectively to terrorist-related events involving the use of chemical, biological, radiological or nuclear explosive (CBRNE) materials. The specific activities are: 1) purchase of personal protective equipment for regional tactical teams (\$419,805); 2) support for contract analysts in the regional Fusion Center (\$500,000); 3) support for one existing CBRNE Administrative Staff Analyst position in the Arson/Bomb/CBRNE Squad and related program costs (\$150,000); and 4) support for the conduct of one CBRNE exercise (\$50,000). The grant covers the period from July 1, 2010 through December 31, 2011. Positions supported by this grant will sunset if funding is discontinued and alternate sources of support cannot be identified. There are no matching requirements or capital improvement projects associated with this grant.</p>	\$1,119,805
1.7	<p>Emergency Management Performance Grant (Seattle Police Department - General Subfund - 00100)</p>	\$329,877

This item increases support to the City's Office of Emergency Management (OEM) through the Chief of Police program in the Seattle Police Department by \$329,877 under the Emergency Management Performance Grant. This program supplements the City's emergency management operating budget, significantly strengthening the City's ability to deal with natural disasters and other emergencies. This grant will support the cost of three existing positions, one Information Technology B, one Strategic Advisor II, and one Administrative Staff Analyst. The term for performance under this grant runs through March 31, 2011. Positions supported by this grant will sunset if funding is discontinued and alternate sources of support cannot be identified. This annually renewable grant has a matching requirement that is met by in-kind resources in the OEM program budget. There are no capital improvement projects associated with this award.



1.8	<p>OCDETF Investigations Agreements (Seattle Police Department - General Subfund - 00100)</p> <p>This item increases support to the Narcotics Investigations program in the Seattle Police Department by \$61,200 from the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) of the Drug Enforcement Administration, U.S. Department of Justice. This item will reimburse the Department for the cost of detective overtime spent in the investigation of three high priority drug cases. The purpose of this work is to disrupt and interdict the flow of illegal drugs into the city. The term of support under these agreements runs through September 30, 2010. There are no matching requirements or capital improvement projects associated with these agreements.</p>	\$61,200
1.9	<p>Traffic Control Staffing Agreement (Seattle Police Department - General Subfund - 00100)</p> <p>This item increases support to the Traffic Enforcement program in the Seattle Police Department by \$20,000 from Sound Transit for provision of traffic control services in conjunction with a light rail track retrofit project in the vicinity of the Mount Baker transit station. Funding provided under agreement with Sound Transit will reimburse the Department for the cost of police overtime to provide these services. There are no matching requirements or capital improvement projects associated with this item.</p>	\$20,000
1.10	<p>Speed Enforcement Emphasis Agreement (Seattle Police Department - General Subfund - 00100)</p> <p>This item increases support to the Traffic Enforcement program in the Seattle Police Department by \$16,065 from the Washington Traffic Safety Commission (WTSC) for speed enforcement emphasis operations. Funding provided under agreement with WTSC will reimburse the Department for the cost of police overtime to conduct speed enforcement operations at high crash areas during the months of April and July. There are no matching requirements or capital improvement projects associated with this item.</p>	\$16,065
1.11	<p>Piper's Creek Flow Control Plan (Seattle Public Utilities - Drainage and Wastewater Fund - 44010)</p>	\$850,904



	<p>This item gives SPU the authority to receive \$850,904 from the Puget Sound Watershed Management Assistance Program within the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). This grant will provide funding to establish a flow control plan for Piper's Creek watershed stormwater using hydrologic modeling and green stormwater infrastructure (GSI) techniques. This reimbursable grant will fund 100% of the project up to \$850,904 through the grant period. Grant money will run from October 1, 2010 through December 31, 2013. A required City Match of \$450,000 will be made through planned spending on the Venema Creek Natural Drainage System (NDS) project (C302317). SPU is requesting \$90,000 in additional budget authority for the 2010 costs; budget authority needed for 2011-2012 will be included as part of the 2011-2012 Proposed Budget.</p>	
1.12	<p>Acceptance of Healthy Eating Active Living (HEAL) Grant (Department of Planning and Development - Planning and Development Fund - 15700)</p> <p>This item increases support to the Department of Planning and Development's Planning Division by \$108,000 from Seattle/King County Public Health for the Creating Healthy Communities project. This grant will support efforts in improving access to locally grown food, in assessing healthy living of our neighborhoods, and in creating new opportunities for healthy food at transit stations. There is no match requirement for the City and no new FTEs are needed. The grant will run from July 18, 2010 through March 12, 2012.</p>	\$108,000
1.13	<p>Acceptance of Healthy Eating Active Living (HEAL) Grant (Human Services Department - Human Services Operating Fund - 16200)</p> <p>This item increases support to the Human Services Department's Area Agency on Aging BCL by \$200,483 from Seattle/King County Public Health. This grant will support a project aimed at reducing the price of fresh produce for 17 congregate meal sites and one home-delivered meal provider by cooperatively purchasing directly from local farmers. There is no match requirement for the City and no new FTEs needed. The grant will run from July 18, 2010 through March 12, 2012.</p>	\$200,483
1.14	<p>Acceptance of Healthy Eating Active Living (HEAL) Grant (Human Services Department - Human Services Operating Fund - 16200)</p>	\$73,000



This item increases support to the Human Services Department's Early Learning and Family Support BCL by \$73,000 from Seattle/King County Public Health. The grant will establish and implement nutrition and physical activity standards for child care and afterschool programs funded by the City of Seattle. This grant provides funding for a 0.5 FTE position and related expenses, and will run from July 18, 2010 through March 12, 2012. There is no match requirement for the City. The position is established in Section 11 of the related second quarter supplemental.

2.1	<p>Riparian Restoration on the Lower Cedar River (Seattle Public Utilities - Water Fund - 43000)</p> <p>This item gives SPU the authority to receive funding of \$902,455 from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The Puget Sound Watershed Management Assistance Program grant supports the Community Partnership for Riparian Restoration on the Lower Cedar River to provide funding for restoration work including knotweed treatment and native vegetation planting, as well as public outreach and education in the Lower Cedar River. There is a required City match of \$298,000 which SPU will fund through planned spending on the Downstream Fish Habitat (C1607) project which this grant supports. The grant will run from June 2010 through June 30, 2014. Budget authority for this project has been approved in the 2010 Adopted Budget and no additional authority is required.</p>	\$902,455



AN ORDINANCE relating to 800 MHz emergency radio communication; authorizing the Director of the Department of Information Technology to execute on behalf of the City an Interlocal Agreement between the City of Seattle, City of Tacoma, Eastside Public Safety Communication Agency, King County, Snohomish County Emergency Radio System, and Valley Communications Center for the purpose of interoperable 800 MHz emergency communications within the Puget Sound region; and ratifying and confirming prior acts.

ORDINANCE NO. 123402

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department; authorizing a 10-year agreement with Pend Oreille County for (1) the loss of revenues and additional financial burdens associated with the City of Seattle's operation of the Boundary Hydroelectric Project on the Pend Oreille River pursuant to RCW 5.21.420, 425, 426, and 427; and (2) the County's agreement to settle all issues relating to City Light's relicensing of the Boundary Hydroelectric Project and the related Sullivan Creek Power Project license surrender.

ORDINANCE NO. 123403

AN ORDINANCE relating to jail services; authorizing the Mayor to execute an Interlocal Agreement with Snohomish County for the Provision of Jail Services; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

ORDINANCE NO. 123404

AN ORDINANCE authorizing, in 2010, acceptance of funding from non-City sources; authorizing the heads of the Office for Education, the Office of Housing, the Seattle Fire Department, the Office for Civil Rights, the Human Services Department, the Department of Planning and Development, the Seattle Police Department, and Seattle Public Utilities to accept specified grants and private funding and to execute, deliver, and perform corresponding agreements.

ORDINANCE NO. 123405

AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance 123177, which adopted the 2010 Budget, including the 2010-2015 Capital Improvement Program (CIP); changing appropriations to various departments and budget control levels, and from various funds in the Budget; adding new projects and revising project allocations for certain projects in the 2010-2015 CIP; creating a position; making transfers between various City funds; making cash transfers between funds; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts, all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

ORDINANCE NO. 123406

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City's municipal golf courses; authorizing the Superintendent of the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation to enter into a management contract with Premier Golf Centers LLC for the operation of the City's municipal golf courses located at Jefferson Park, Jackson Park, West Seattle, and Interbay; authorizing the Superintendent to set golf fees consistent with that agreement and authorizing the Department to collect such fees.

AN ORDINANCE appropriating money to pay certain audited claims and ordering the payment thereof.
