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4 AN ORDINANCE relating to youth employment and mentoring programs; changing
5 appropriations to the Department of Neighborhoods, Department of Parks and Recreation
6 and Human Services Department; and removing a proviso in Ordinance 124058.

7 WHEREAS, the 2013-2014 Proposed Budget included funding to expand the Seattle Youth
8 Violence Prevention Initiative (Initiative) in the Department of Neighborhoods in both
9 2013 and 2014, which in combination would increase the total funding for the Initiative
10 from nearly \$4 million per year to nearly \$6 million per year; and

11 WHEREAS, Resolution 31404, adopted in 2012, established standards for the measurement of
12 program performance and program evaluation, and stated the City Council's intent to
13 review the effectiveness of any programs proposed for significant expansion, and
14 Resolution 31425, adopted in 2013, reiterated these standards and this intent; and

15 WHEREAS, in its review of the 2013-2014 Proposed Budget and the proposed expansion of the
16 Initiative the Council questioned whether enough is known about the effectiveness of the
17 Initiative to warrant the expansion; and

18 WHEREAS, the Council accordingly requested that the City Auditor develop an evaluation plan
19 for the Initiative and provided funding for this work, and imposed a proviso on
20 \$1,020,181 of the funding appropriated to the Department of Neighborhoods in 2013 for
21 the expansion of the Initiative pending a satisfactory evaluation plan; and

22 WHEREAS, on January 31, 2013 the City Auditor reported that he was unable to develop a
23 complete evaluation plan due to unresolved fundamental questions about the Initiative's
24 goals, strategies and intended outcomes; and

25 WHEREAS, on March 22, 2013, the City Auditor reported that he and the Department of
26 Neighborhoods had agreed to attempt to resolve these questions so that an evaluation
27 plan might be developed later this year; and

28 WHEREAS, while the City Auditor and Department of Neighborhoods resolve these questions
and develop an evaluation plan for the Initiative, the Council wishes to support
employment and mentoring programs for disadvantaged youth, and wishes to support a
limited expansion of the Initiative in 2013; and



1 WHEREAS, the Council intends to review any 2014 budget proposals for further expansion of
2 the Initiative in light of Resolution 31425 and the progress made by the City Auditor and
Department of Neighborhoods in developing an evaluation plan;

3 NOW, THEREFORE,

4 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

5 Section 1. In order to pay for necessary costs and expenses to be incurred in 2013, but for
6 which insufficient appropriations were made due to causes that could not reasonably have been
7 foreseen when the 2013 Budget was adopted, appropriations for the following items in the 2013
8 Budget are altered from the funds shown, as follows:

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18 The Council intends that the funds appropriated to the Department of Parks and
19 Recreation and Human Services Department be spent on youth employment programs and
20 related youth mentoring.

21 Unspent funds so appropriated shall carry forward to subsequent fiscal years until they
22 are exhausted or abandoned by ordinance.



1 Section 2. The restrictions imposed by the following budget proviso, which limits
2 spending on the following item, are removed because the conditions set forth in the proviso have
3 been satisfied and they are no longer restricted for any purpose, including those set forth in
4 Subsection 1c of Ordinance 124058.

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to youth employment and mentoring programs; changing appropriations to the Department of Neighborhoods, Department of Parks and Recreation and Human Services Department; and removing a proviso in Ordinance 124058.

Summary of the Legislation:

This ordinance reduces the 2013 appropriation for the Seattle Youth Violence Prevention Initiative (Initiative) by \$500,000, increases the appropriation for youth employment programs in Parks and Recreation by \$210,000, increases the appropriation for youth employment and related mentoring programs in Human Services by \$290,000, and removes a budget proviso on funding for the expansion of the Initiative.

Background:

The 2013-2014 Proposed Budget included funding to expand the Initiative by increasing its total funding from nearly \$4 million to nearly \$6 million. The Council questioned whether the City knows enough about the effectiveness of the Initiative to warrant this increase. It placed a proviso on the expansion funding and asked the City Auditor to develop an evaluation plan. The City Auditor reported that he was unable to develop a complete evaluation plan due to unresolved fundamental questions about the Initiative's goals, strategies and intended outcomes. The Auditor and Initiative management are attempting to resolve these questions, in the hope of developing an evaluation plan later this year.

In the meantime, the Council wishes to support youth employment and mentoring programs for disadvantaged youth, and is willing to support a limited expansion of the Initiative. Parks and Human Services currently operate youth employment and mentoring programs that can be expanded.

The Council intends to review any budget proposals for further expansion of the Initiative in 2014 in light of Resolution 31425 and the progress made by the Auditor and Initiative management in developing an evaluation plan.

Dear Councilmember Harrell,

As part of my proposed 2013 budget, I transmitted a plan to expand the Seattle Youth Violence Prevention Initiative (SYVPI) and serve 450 more youth. The City Council adopted a proviso that withheld most of the funding for the expansion until the Council approved a logic model and evaluation path for SYVPI. Because of the delay caused because that process took four months to complete, and because the Council then reduced funding for the proposed expansion, SYVPI will only be able to serve an additional 225 youth this year, half the number we had proposed to serve. The total SYVPI service level will be 1,275 young people rather than 1,500.

The SYVPI expansion proposal was comprised of a comprehensive and integrated set of programs and supports consistent with the model of community-based service delivery that has been pioneered by SYVPI and has been so well embraced by the community. Employment and mentoring are two core service components that must be integrated into SYVPI service delivery. By appropriating \$500,000 of the \$1,020,000 that was to be used for SYVPI expansion to Parks and HSD, rather than to SYVPI, the Council reduced the number of youth served in SYVPI and potentially jeopardized integrated service delivery.

In order to best serve SYVPI youth and keep with the goals and outcomes of the original 2013 funding proposal for SYVPI, I am directing my departments to spend \$265,000 of the \$500,000 appropriated to Parks and HSD via Council Bill 117763 on employment and mentoring programs for SYVPI youth. Of the \$265,000, \$190,000 will be spent on SYVPI youth employment and \$75,000 will be spent on SYVPI mentoring; these funds will be used to provide integrated services through SYVPI. This is consistent with Council's intent to allocate funds to Parks and HSD for youth employment and mentoring programs, and it allows us to provide comprehensive services to the additional 225 SYVPI youth this year.

The evaluation standards that the Council applied to SYVPI are not consistently applied to other programs, including to the funding Council appropriated to Parks and HSD through Council Bill 117763. Whereas SYVPI was required to have a Council sanctioned logic model and evaluation

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strategy, no such requirements were placed on the \$500,000 in funding allocated to Parks and HSD. I believe that program evaluation should be used to inform course corrections and program improvements. I intend to work with the Council to ensure that City departments incorporate meaningful and appropriate evaluation strategies that result in improving the efficacy of City programs.
