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4 AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department, authorizing the extension of the
5 franchise from the City of Shoreline to construct, operate, maintain, replace and repair an
6 electrical light and power system in, across, over, along, under, through and below certain
7 designated public rights-of-way, to July 31, 2014 or the effective date of a replacement
8 franchise agreement, whichever occurs first.

9 WHEREAS Seattle City Light is authorized to construct, operate, maintain, replace and repair its
10 electrical light and power system in, across, over, along, under, through and below certain
11 designated public rights-of-way in the City of Shoreline under a franchise granted by the
12 City of Shoreline Ordinance 187 and accepted by the City of Seattle by Ordinance
13 119312; and

14 WHEREAS, Seattle City Light's current franchise with the City of Shoreline is scheduled to
15 expire on January 31, 2014; and

16 WHEREAS, the City of Seattle and the City of Shoreline are negotiating the terms and
17 conditions of a new franchise and need additional time to conclude the negotiations; and


18 WHEREAS, it is also required that the Shoreline City Council approve the extension by
19 ordinance for this extension to be effective; NOW, THEREFORE,

20 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

21 Section 1. That the City of Seattle authorizes the extension of the franchise from the City
22 of Shoreline to construct, operate, maintain, replace and repair an electrical light and power
23 system to serve residential, multi-family and commercial areas, to July 31, 2014 or the effective
24 date of a replacement franchise agreement, whichever occurs first.
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
1 Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after
2 its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days
3 after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

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

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department, authorizing the extension of the franchise from the City of Shoreline to construct, operate, maintain, replace and repair an electrical light and power system in, across, over, along, under, through and below certain designated public rights-of-way, to July 31, 2014 or the effective date of a replacement franchise agreement, whichever occurs first.

Summary of the Legislation:

This ordinance authorizes an extension for the franchise from the City of Shoreline to construct, operate, maintain, replace and repair an electrical light and power system in, across, over, along, under, through and below certain designated public rights-of-way, to July 31, 2014 or the effective date of a replacement franchise agreement, whichever occurs first. The current Franchise Agreement expires on January 31, 2014. Seattle City Light and the City of Shoreline have been engaged in negotiations to renew the current franchise. In order to successfully complete these negotiations and comply with the two cities' legislative timelines, an extension of the existing franchise is warranted.

Background:

Seattle City Light provides electric service to the residents and businesses in the City of Shoreline under a 15 year Franchise Agreement, which was effective beginning January 1, 1999, granted by the City of Shoreline Ordinance 187 and accepted by the City of Seattle by Ordinance 119312. The Franchise Agreement grants Seattle City Light a non-exclusive franchise to operate within the City of Shoreline's rights-of-way, and establishes terms and conditions under which Seattle City Light and the City of Shoreline work together on a variety of franchise issues, including rates as established by the Seattle City Council, fees, and operational requirements.

Since late 2012, Seattle City Light and the City of Shoreline have been engaged in discussions to renegotiate the Franchise Agreement. Meetings were held with the City of Shoreline to discuss what is working well with the current Franchise Agreement and to identify areas for improvement. Subsequently, Seattle City Light has been working internally and with City of Shoreline to draft and negotiate a new franchise agreement that will maintain consistency with Seattle City Light's Strategic Plan, and provide the City of Shoreline with the same level of outstanding service, reliability, environmental stewardship, and accountability as we provide for customers within the Seattle city limits.

This legislation does not have any financial implications.

This legislation has financial implications.

Other Implications:

a) Does the legislation have indirect financial implications, or long-term implications?

This legislation extends the term of the current Franchise Agreement and will allow the two parties to continue negotiating the terms of a new long-term franchise agreement to provide electrical service to residents and businesses within the City of Shoreline and for Seattle City Light to continue to construct, operate, maintain, replace and repair its system within the City of Shoreline's rights-of-way.

b) What is the financial cost of not implementing the legislation?

Failure to pass this extension ordinance would not have direct financial impacts until the existing Franchise Agreement expires without a new agreement to replace it. However if a new agreement is not in place by January 31, 2014, then the financial impacts could be significant, and well beyond the scope of this note.

c) Does this legislation affect any departments besides the originating department?

d) What are the possible alternatives to the legislation that could achieve the same or similar objectives?

Finalize negotiations and execute a new franchise agreement without the extension and authorize the new agreement through an ordinance with a full ratify and confirm clause for the new franchise.





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
