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4 AN ORDINANCE relating to historic preservation, imposing controls upon the Metropolitan
5 Printing Press Company Building, a landmark designated by the Landmarks Preservation
6 Board under Chapter 25.12 of the Seattle Municipal Code, and adding it to the Table of
7 Historical Landmarks contained in Chapter 25.32 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

8 WHEREAS, the Landmarks Ordinance, Chapter 25.12 of the Seattle Municipal Code (SMC),
9 establishes a procedure for the designation and preservation of sites, improvements, and
10 objects having historical, cultural, architectural, engineering, or geographic significance;
11 and

12 WHEREAS, the Landmarks Preservation Board (Board), after a public meeting on May 7, 2008,
13 voted to approve the nomination of the improvement located at 2107 Third Avenue
14 (which is referred to as the "Metropolitan Printing Press Company Building" for the
15 purposes of this ordinance) for designation as a landmark under SMC Chapter 25.12; and

16 WHEREAS, after a public meeting on July 2, 2008, the Board voted to approve the designation
17 of the Metropolitan Printing Press Company Building under SMC Chapter 25.12; and

18 WHEREAS, on March 21, 2012, the Board and the owner of the designated landmark agreed to
19 controls and incentives; and

20 WHEREAS, the Board recommends that the City Council enact a designating ordinance
21 approving the controls and incentives; NOW, THEREFORE,

22 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

23 Section 1. DESIGNATION: Pursuant to SMC 25.12.660, the designation by the
24 Landmarks Preservation Board (Board) of the improvement located at 2107 Third Avenue
25 (which is referred to as the "Metropolitan Printing Press Company Building" for the purposes of
26 this ordinance) is hereby acknowledged.
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1 A. Legal Description. The Metropolitan Printing Press Company Building is located
2 on the property legally described as:

3 Lot 10, Block 48 of the addition to the City of Seattle, as laid out by A.A. Denny,
4 commonly known as A.A. Denny's 6th Addition to the City of Seattle, according
5 to the plat recorded in Volume 1 of Plats, Page 99, records of King County,
6 Washington;

7 Except the Easterly 12 feet thereof condemned in Superior Court Cause No.
8 52280, as provided under Ordinance No. 13776 of the City of Seattle;
9 Situated in the City of Seattle, County of King, State of Washington.
10

11 B. Specific Features or Characteristics Designated. Pursuant to SMC 25.12.660.A.2,
12 the following specific features or characteristics of the Metropolitan Printing Press Company
13 Building are designated: the exterior of the building.
14

15 C. Basis of Designation. The designation was made because the Metropolitan
16 Printing Press Company Building is more than 25 years old, has significant character, interest or
17 value as a part of the development, heritage or cultural characteristics of the City, state or nation,
18 has integrity or the ability to convey its significance, and satisfies the following from SMC
19 25.12.350: it embodies the distinctive visible characteristics of an architectural style, period, or a
20 method of construction (SMC 25.12.350.D).
21

22 D. Section 2. CONTROLS: The following controls are hereby imposed on the
23 features or characteristics of the Metropolitan Printing Press Company Building that were
24 designated by the Board for preservation:

25 A. Certificate of Approval Process.
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1. Except as provided in subsection 2.A.2 or subsection 2.B, the owner must obtain a Certificate of Approval issued by the Board pursuant to SMC Chapter 25.12, or the time for denying a Certificate of Approval must have expired, before the owner may make alterations or significant changes to the following specific features or characteristics: the exterior of the building.
2. No Certificate of Approval is required for the following: any in-kind maintenance or repairs of the features or characteristics listed in subsection 2.A.1.

B. City Historic Preservation Officer Approval Process.

1. The City Historic Preservation Officer (CHPO) may review and approve alterations or significant changes to the features or characteristics listed in subsection 2.B.3 according to the following procedure:
 - a. The owner shall submit to the CHPO a written request for the alterations or significant changes, including applicable drawings or specifications.
 - b. If the CHPO, upon examination of submitted plans and specifications, determines that the alterations or significant changes are consistent with the purposes of SMC Chapter 25.12, the CHPO shall approve the alterations or significant changes without further action by the Board.
 - c. If the CHPO does not approve the alterations or significant changes, the owner may submit revised materials to the CHPO, or apply to the Board for a Certificate of Approval under SMC Chapter 25.12.



1 2. The CHPO shall transmit a written decision on the owner's request to the owner
2 within 14 days of receipt of the request. Failure of the CHPO to timely transmit a
3 written decision constitutes approval of the request.

4 3. CHPO approval of alterations or significant changes to the features or
5 characteristics listed in subsection 2.A.1 is available for the following:

6 a. The installation, alteration, or removal of duct conduits, HVAC vents, grilles,
7 fire escapes, pipes, and other similar wiring or mechanical elements necessary
8 for the normal operation of the building.

9 b. The installation, alteration, or removal of exterior security lighting, video
10 cameras, and security system equipment.

11 c. The installation, alteration, or removal of signage.

12 Section 3. INCENTIVES: The following incentives are hereby granted on the features or
13 characteristics of the Metropolitan Printing Press Company Building that were designated by the
14 Board for preservation:

15 A. Uses not otherwise permitted in a zone may be authorized in a designated
16 Landmark by means of an administrative conditional use permit issued pursuant to Seattle
17 Municipal Code Title 23.

18 B. Special tax valuation for historic preservation may be available under RCW
19 Chapter 84.26 upon application and compliance with the requirements of that statute.

20 C. Exceptions to certain requirements of the Seattle Building Code, SMC Chapter
21 22.100, and the Seattle Energy Code, SMC Chapter 22.700, may be authorized pursuant to the
22 applicable provisions thereof.



1 D. The Owner may be eligible to participate in the City's Landmark Transfer of
2 Development Rights (TDR) Bank after obtaining a determination from the City concerning the
3 quantity of unused development rights for the Landmark that are eligible for transfer to receiving
4 properties as Landmark TDR, pursuant to SMC 23.49.014.

5 Section 4. Enforcement of this ordinance and penalties for its violation are as provided in
6 SMC 25.12.910.

7 Section 5. The Metropolitan Printing Press Company Building is hereby added
8 alphabetically to Section II, Buildings, of the Table of Historical Landmarks contained in SMC
9 Chapter 25.32.

10 Section 6. The City Clerk is directed to record a certified copy of this ordinance with the
11 King County Director of Records and Elections, deliver two certified copies to the CHPO, and
12 deliver one copy to the Director of the Department of Planning and Development. The CHPO is
13 directed to provide a certified copy of the ordinance to the owner of the landmark.
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1 Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by
2 the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it
3 shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.
