BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the westerly fifty (50) feet of Lots Seven (7), Eight (8), Nine (9), Ten (10), Eleven (11) and Twelve (12), in Blocks Thirty (30) and Thirty-five (35) of John H. Nagle's Second Addition to the City of Seattle, be and the same hereby are dedicated to the public for the purposes of a public Street to be known as "Nagle Place."
