ORDINANCE NO. 80544

AN ORDINANCE relating to For-Hire Driver's Licenses and amending Section 111 of the License Code to change the fees therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 111 of the License Code (Ordinance No. 48022) be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 111. DRIVER'S LICENSE FEES. The fees for a For-Hire Driver's License shall be as follows: For each original license \$15.00, which shall be paid at the time of making application; and for each annual renewal thereafter the sum of \$4.00, which shall be paid at the time of making the application for renewal; Provided that the fee for the new license required in Section 108 of Ordinance No. 48022, at the end of the four successive years following the expiration of the original license shall be \$4.00 per annum: Provided further, that such fees shall not be required for drivers employed by the city in the operation of Transit buses and no charge shall be made by the Public Health Department for examining applicants for Drivers' Licenses.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section .2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.


Pursuant to your request we herewith transmit proposed ordinance amending Section 111 of the License Code (Ordinance No. 48022) as last amended by Ordinance No. 75087, to increase the fee for an original Driver's License to \$15.00 and to increase the annual renewal for such license from \$2.00 to \$4.00, and further providing that said renewal fee of \$4.00 shall continue after the expiration of the fourth annual renewal following the expiration of the original license. The suggestion of continuation of the four dollar renewal for after five years is not contained in the Comptroller's letter but has been orally requested by the Director of Licenses, who has approved the form of the draft.



BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 111 of the License Code (Ordinance No. 48022) be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 111. DRIVER'S LICENSE FEES. The fees for a For-Hire Driver's License shall be as follows: For each original license \$15.00, which shall be paid at the time of making application; and for each annual renewal thereafter the sum of \$4.00, which shall be paid at the time of making the application for renewal. Provided that the fee for the new license required in Section 108 of Ordinance No. 48022, at the end of the four successive years following the expiration of the original license shall be \$4.00 per annum. Provided further that such fees shall not be required for drivers employed by the city in the operation of Transit buses and no charge shall be made by the Public Health Department for examining applicants for Drivers Licenses.
