ORDINANCE 91281

AN ORDINANCE amending Section 207 of the License Code (Ordinance 48022) to increase the amount of indemnity bond required in connection with Side Sewer Contractor's Licenses and to except from such bond requirements certain applicants who have filed an indemnity bond under Section 11 of Ordinance 90047.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 207 of Ordinance No. 48022 (License Code) as last amended by Ordinance 89733 be further amended to read as follows:

Section 207. Anyone desiring a Side Sewer Contractor's License shall make application therefor in writing to the City Comptroller upon a blank form to be furnished for that purpose. The application shall be referred to the City Engineer for his approval, or disapproval. The applicant shall be required to present satisfactory evidence to the City Engineer that he is reliable and skilled in the laying and construction of side sewers, and that he has sufficient knowledge and experience to carry on the business of a Side Sewer Contractor. If the City Engineer approves the application and other requirements of this ordinance relating to Side Sewer Contractors have been complied with, the City Comptroller shall issue such license.

In the event that the application is not approved by the City Engineer, such license shall be denied.

Every applicant for a Side Sewer Contractor's License must file with the City Comptroller a bond in the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) conditioned that the applicant and licensee will indemnify and save harmless The City of Seattle from all claims, actions, or damages of every kind and description which may accrue to or be suffered by any person by reason of any opening in any street, alley, avenue or other public place made by him or those in his employ, in making any connection with any public or

private sewer, or for any other purpose or object whatever, and that he will also replace and restore such street, alley, avenue or other public place to as good a state and condition as at the time of commencement of said work, and maintain the same in good order, and that he will comply with all of the provisions of this ordinance and any other ordinance of the City of Seattle, relating to the business of Side Sewer Contractor. The provisions of this section shall not apply to work performed by The City of Seattle under authority of sections numbered 4, 5 and 6 of Ordinance No. 25150, approved September 20, 1910, or to applicants for a side sewer contractor's license who have on file with the City Comptroller a bond filed in conformance with Section 11 of Ordinance 90047, in an amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or more. Every presently licensed Side Sewer Contractor shall increase the amount of his bond to Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) by November 30, 1962.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 297 of Ordinance No. 45822 (License Code) as last amended by Ordinance 28733 be further amended to read as follows:

Section 297. Anyone desiring a Side Sewer Contractor's License shall make application therefor in writing to the City Comptroller upon a blank form to be furnished for that purpose. The application shall be referred to the City Engineer for his approval or disapproval. The applicant shall be required to present satisfactory evidence to the City Engineer that he is reliable and skilled in the laying and construction of side sewers, and that he has sufficient knowledge and experience to carry on the business of a Side Sewer Contractor. If the City Engineer approves the application and other requirements of this ordinance relating to Side Sewer Contractors have been complied with, the City Comptroller shall issue such license.

In the event that the application is not approved by the City Engineer, such license shall be denied.

Every applicant for a Side Sewer Contractor's License must file with the City Comptroller a bond in the sum of FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,000.00) conditioned that the applicant and licensee will indemnify and save harmless The City of Seattle from all claims, actions or damages of every kind and description which may accrue to or be suffered by any person by reason of any opening in any street, alley, avenue or other public place made by him or those in his employ in making any connection with any public or private sewer, or for any other purpose or object whatever and that he will also replace and restore such street, alley, avenue or other public place to as good a state and condition as at the time of commencement of said work, and maintain the same in good order and that he will comply with all of the provisions of this ordinance and any other ordinance of the City of Seattle relating to the business of Side Sewer Contractor. The provisions of this section shall not apply to work performed by The City of Seattle under authority of sections numbered 4, 5 and 6 of Ordinance No. 25150 approved September 26, 1918 OR TO APPLICANTS FOR A SIDE SEWER CONTRACTOR'S LICENSE WHO HAVE ON FILE WITH THE
