ORDINANCE 99492

AN ORDINANCE relating to and imposing certain charges in connection with the administration of public works contracts by the Board of Public Works.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there is hereby imposed a charge of Two Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2.50) per day from date of execution to date of acceptance of the work as to each and every public works contract administered by the Board of Public Works, such charge to be computed by the Secretary of the Board of Public Works and billed to the department or fund for which such contract is administered, and the receipts therefrom shall be deposited in the General Fund.

**ORDINANCE NO. 99492**

AN ORDINANCE relating to and imposing certain charges in connection with the administration of public works contracts by the Board of Public Works.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there is hereby imposed a charge of Two Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2.50) per day from date of execution to date of acceptance of the work as to each and every public works contract administered by the Board of Public Works, such charge to be computed by the Secretary of the Board of Public Works and billed to the department or fund for which such contract is administered, and the receipts therefrom shall be deposited in the General Fund.
