ORDINANCE 99749

AN ORDINANCE amending Section 2.010 of Ordinance 89715 to authorize special permits for temporary encampments of mobile homes.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 2.010 of Ordinance 89715 is amended to read as follows:

Section 2.010. It is unlawful to operate a Mobile Home Park without a valid and subsisting "Mobile Home Park License" which shall be posted in a conspicuous place in the office thereof at all times. The fee for such license shall be Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) per year, plus Two Dollars (\$2.00) per year for each Mobile Home Lot therein in excess of ten (10). The fee for any such license issued during the last six (6) months of the license year shall be one-half the annual fee. Mobile Home Park licenses shall expire at midnight July 31 of each year, and applications for renewal shall be made at least thirty (30) days prior to expiration.

The Director of Public Health is authorized on application and payment only of a fee of \$25.00 to issue a special permit for temporary encampments of mobile homes for a period of not to exceed 10 days if he finds from the application and plans submitted therewith that the requirements of this ordinance relating to sanitation, fire prevention, garbage disposal, traffic, water supply, lighting and electric service will be satisfied to an extent reasonably practicable considering the nature of the site to be used, the number of mobile homes expected, the length of time of the encampment, the season of the year, and other pertinent circumstances, and that the requirements of other ordinances of the City are or will be satisfied. Temporary structures shall be authorized only by the Board of Public Works as provided in Section 208 of the Building Code (85500).

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.





# Affidavit of Publication

**ORDINANCE NO. 99749**  
AN ORDINANCE amending Section 2.810 of Ordinance 99715 to authorize special permits for temporary encampments of mobile homes.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 2.810 of Ordinance 99715 is amended to read as follows:

Section 2.810. It is unlawful to operate a Mobile Home Park without a valid and subsisting "Mobile Home Park License" which shall be posted in a conspicuous place in the office thereof at all times. The fee for such license shall be Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) per year plus Two Dollars (\$2.00) per year for each Mobile Home Lot there-in in excess of ten (10). The fee for any such license issued during the last six (6) months of the license year shall be one-half the annual fee. Mobile Home Park licenses shall expire at midnight July 31 of each year, and applications for renewal shall be made at least thirty (30) days prior to expiration.

THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC HEALTH IS AUTHORIZED ON APPLICATION AND PAYMENT ONLY OF A FEE OF \$25.00 TO ISSUE A SPECIAL PERMIT FOR TEMPORARY ENCAMPMENTS OF MOBILE HOMES FOR A PERIOD OF NOT TO EXCEED 10 DAYS IF HE FINDS FROM THE APPLICATION AND PLANS SUBMITTED THEREWITH THAT THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS ORDINANCE RELATING TO SANITATION, FIRE PREVENTION, GARBAGE DISPOSAL, TRAFFIC, WATER SUPPLY, LIGHTING AND ELECTRIC SERVICE WILL BE SATISFIED TO AN EXTENT REASONABLY PRACTICABLE CONSIDERING THE NATURE OF THE SITE TO BE USED, THE NUMBER OF MOBILE HOMES EXPECTED, THE LENGTH OF TIME OF THE ENCAMPMENT, THE SEASON OF THE YEAR, AND OTHER PERTINENT CIRCUMSTANCES, AND THAT THE REQUIREMENTS OF OTHER ORDINANCES OF THE CITY AND OR WILL BE SATISFIED. TEMPORARY STRUCTURES SHALL BE AUTHORIZED ONLY BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 2.8 OF THE BUILDING CODE (45500).

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
