BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That as of January 1, 1971 the Police Department is authorized to collect fees for certain reports or services by said department as follows:

12. Data Processing Services and such consultation and/or examination of physical evidence by Police Department personnel per man-hour 20.00

all as recommended by the Mayor in C.F. 267673.

Section 2. The reports, records, and services contemplated in Section 1 hereof shall be furnished under the direction of the Chief of Police and in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by him.

Section 3. The fee schedule provided in Section 1 hereof may be amended, modified or added to from time to time upon recommendation of the Chief of Police and approval by resolution of the City Council.

Section 4. That Ordinance 89685 entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE relating to the Police Department, prescribing fees for certain services and records furnished by said department under rules and regulations adopted by the Chief of Police."

and Ordinance 93158 entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE relating to the Police Department and prescribing fees for certain data processing and consultation services performed by said department."

are hereby repealed and Resolutions 19378, 19616 and 20555 are hereby rescinded.

Section 5. That any act pursuant to the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.


