
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE:

Section 1. As requested by the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation and recommended by the Mayor in materials attached hereto, the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation is hereby authorized for and on behalf of The City of Seattle to submit a grant application to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, a federal agency, in the amount of Twenty-four Thousand Two Hundred Eighty-Five Dollars (\$24,285) for the purpose of developing a running/jogging track; soccer goal posts; improvements to the performance stage; and music/drama instruction for youth in order to enhance the youth sports and cultural activities (clubs) at Yesler Community Center in Yesler Terrace Housing Project.


Section 2. As requested by the Director of the Department of Community Development (DCD) and recommended by the Mayor, the Director of DCD is hereby authorized for and on behalf of the City of Seattle to submit a grant application to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, a federal agency, in the amount of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) for the purpose of developing a multi-use sports field at the Rainier Vista community.

Section 3. The Superintendent and Director of DCD are hereby authorized to furnish such additional information as may be required in connection with such applications and to act as the authorized representatives of the City in connection herewith.



Application to the Department of Housing and Urban
Development

The Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation is submitting a grant application to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, a federal agency. The grant application makes a request of \$24,285 for the Recreation Division to develop a running/jogging track, place soccer goal posts at the Yesler Community Center playfield, improve the performance stage in the Center and provide music/drama instruction for low income youth residing in Yesler Terrace Housing Project.

The goal of the proposed program is to aid public housing youth in areas affected by drug problems by providing positive youth programs, particularly anti-drug programs such as sports, cultural and other activities which can serve to provide alternatives to a living environment plagued by drug usage or trade. Grant funds will be used to develop amenities supporting the sport and cultural activities at Yesler Community Center as well as provide instruction in music/drama for the youth.

We are requesting adoption of the attached legislation authorizing this grant application. Your favorable action is needed as soon as possible in order for us to be considered for this grant.


Attached for your review and action is a proposed resolution which, if adopted, would authorize DCD and the Parks Department to make two separate grant applications to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The applications are being made in response to a Notice of Fund Availability under a HUD special grant program aimed at promoting a drug-free environment in public housing by providing positive activities for youth.

To expedite the legislative approval process, we have combined into one proposed resolution the request for legislative approval for both grant applications.

In addition to the Yesler Community Center grant application described in the accompanying Parks department cover letter, DCD is sponsoring the Rainier Vista Multi-Sports Field Project. This grant application requests \$25,000 from HUD to assist in the construction and development of a multi-use field for soccer, football, and track activities. This grant, along with a Neighborhood Matching Fund allocation of \$100,000 and approximately \$293,000 in matching community resources, will enable the Variety Boys and Girls club to substantially expand their athletic programs serving the youth in the Rainier Vista and Holly Park communities.


