


**RESOLUTION 30850**

A RESOLUTION establishing the City's intent to develop a prioritized list for daylighting pipes and culverts where this would benefit salmon and to analyze resources that could be used to encourage property owners to daylight pipes and culverts.

WHEREAS, The City of Seattle's drainage system includes pipes and culverts; and

WHEREAS, some of these pipes and culverts contain salmon and, whenever possible, developers should be discouraged from building over a Type 1-5 stream located in an underground pipe or culvert; and

WHEREAS, The City of Seattle is committed to the protection and improvement of salmon habitat; and

WHEREAS, daylighting pipes and culverts has been proven to improve salmon habitat; and

WHEREAS, daylighting pipes and culverts could offer additional benefits such as improved flood control, water quality, wildlife habitat and public amenities; and

WHEREAS, the City currently lacks a prioritized analysis of which pipes and culverts, if daylighted, would produce the greatest benefit to salmon; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to encourage property owners and developers to daylight creeks and streams; NOW, THEREFORE,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE THAT:**

Section 1. The Council requests that Seattle Public Utilities and the Office of Sustainability and the Environment work together to perform an analysis, and produce a report, that prioritizes which pipes and culverts would benefit salmon the most if daylighted. This report should be delivered to the Environment, Emergency Management and Utilities Committee by June 27, 2006.


Section 2. The Council requests that the Department of Planning and Development and Seattle Public Utilities work together to create a list of potential resources and incentives,






