WHEREAS, Gregory J. Nickels began his public service career with the City of Seattle at age 19 while attending the University of Washington; and

WHEREAS, Gregory J. Nickels has served the people of Seattle and King County with distinction in many capacities including as legislative assistant to City Councilmember Norm Rice from 1978 to 1987; and as a Councilmember on the King County Council from 1987 to 2001; and

WHEREAS, Gregory J. Nickels became the 51st Mayor of the City of Seattle on January 1, 2002 and was re-elected to serve a second term beginning January 1, 2006; and

WHEREAS, Gregory J. Nickels has served as Mayor of Seattle as an effective and tireless advocate for strong environmental policies, equality for all people through the Race and Social Justice Initiative and improvements in public transportation including serving as chair of the Sound Transit Board; and

WHEREAS, Gregory J. Nickels will leave Seattle a better place due to his work to improve Seattle neighborhoods; his support of economic development to create good jobs; his efforts to prioritize human services by protecting those less fortunate and funding thousands of units of low and moderate-income housing; his work with the City Council on funding for new positions within the police department and to rebuild and modernize the City's fire stations to ensure public safety; his work to rebuild Seattle's transportation infrastructure; NOW THEREFORE,


BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THAT:




