1 A RESOLUTION approving the composition of the Major Institution Citizens Advisory  
2 Committee for Swedish Medical Center's Cherry Hill Campus.

3 WHEREAS, Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) Chapter 23.69 regulates Seattle's major educational  
4 and medical institutions to balance a number of policies and objectives, and the master  
5 plan process is an important element of the Major Institutions policies; and

6 WHEREAS, Swedish Medical Center has informed the City of its intent to prepare a master plan  
7 for its Cherry Hill Campus for consideration by the City; and

8 WHEREAS, SMC Chapter 23.69 requires the establishment of a Citizens Advisory Committee  
9 immediately following submittal to the City of a notice of intent to prepare a master plan;  
and

10 WHEREAS, the objective of the selection of the Citizens Advisory Committee members is to  
11 provide a balanced representative group with a majority of membership from adjacent  
neighborhood(s); and

12 WHEREAS, to the extent possible, members should possess expertise or experience in such  
13 areas as neighborhood organization and issues, land use and zoning, architecture,  
14 landscape architecture, economic development, building development and educational or  
medical services; and

15 WHEREAS, the Department of Neighborhoods has worked with Swedish Medical Center to  
16 develop a list of 12 potential members to serve on the Citizens Advisory Committee for  
17 its Cherry Hill Campus; and

18 WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods has reviewed the list of potential  
19 members, none of whom has a direct economic relationship with the institution (except  
20 the non-management representative of Swedish Medical Center), and recommended them  
to the Council as stipulated in Ordinance 115002; and

21 WHEREAS, the City Council's Parks and Neighborhoods Committee has reviewed the  
22 Director's recommendation and determined that the full complement of 12 members  
23 would provide a balanced, representative and independent committee; NOW,  
THEREFORE,

24 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THE**  
25 **MAYOR CONCURRING, THAT:**



1 Section 1. The recommendations of the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods  
2 and the City Council's Parks and Neighborhoods Committee regarding the composition of the  
3 Citizens Advisory Committee for Swedish Medical Center's Cherry Hill Campus (the "Advisory  
4 Committee") are affirmed and the City Council authorizes the Director of the Department of  
5 Neighborhoods to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with Swedish Medical Center  
6 substantially in the form of the agreement attached as Exhibit 1 hereto and made a part of this  
7 resolution.

9 Section 2. The Advisory Committee shall be staffed by the Department of  
10 Neighborhoods with the cooperation and assistance of Swedish Medical Center. Technical  
11 assistance will be provided by the Department of Planning and Development, the Department of  
12 Neighborhoods, and the Seattle Department of Transportation.

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## MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT between the City of Seattle and Swedish Medical Center, a major institution within the meaning of Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) Chapter 23.69, establishing the composition of the Citizens Advisory Committee for Swedish Medical Center's Cherry Hill Campus to perform the functions that SMC Chapter 23.69 authorizes such a committee to undertake.

WHEREAS, the Department of Neighborhoods and Swedish Medical Center have developed a list of potential members to serve on the Citizens Advisory Committee for the Cherry Hill Campus; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods has reviewed the list of potential members, none of whom has a direct economic relationship with the institution (except the non-management representative of Swedish Medical Center), and recommended them to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council's Parks and Neighborhoods Committee has reviewed the recommendation of the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods and determined that the members would constitute a reasonably balanced, representative and independent committee and has so recommended to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the full Council has voted to approve the recommendation of the Parks and Neighborhood's Committee:

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AND SWEDISH MEDICAL CENTER THAT:

### SECTION 1 – INITIAL VOTING MEMBERS

The initial voting members of the Citizens Advisory Committee for Swedish Medical Center's Cherry Hill Campus shall be the following persons, each of whom meets the criteria for appointment to the Committee and brings the desired skills as listed below:

**Key to Categories and Skills:** The Code states that persons may be appointed to the Committee from the following categories:

- 1) Representatives of area community groups;
- 2) Residents (for purposes of analysis we separate this category into near and general neighbors to indicate those residing closest to the institution);
  - a) Near neighbor (within ¼ mile of the boundaries of the Cherry Hill Campus)
  - b) General neighbor (within the Central Community Center Service Area)
- 3) Property owners;
- 4) Business persons;
- 5) Consumer groups using the services of the institution;
- 6) Persons participating in neighborhood planning; and
- 7) General community or citywide representatives.

The Code mandates that there be at least one person from categories 6 and 7 above.

The Code also states that to the extent possible, members of the Citizens Advisory Committee should possess expertise or experience in such areas as:

- a) Neighborhood organization and issues;
- b) Land use and zoning;
- c) Architecture or landscape architecture;
- d) Economic development;
- e) Building development; and
- f) Educational or medical services.

A non-management representative of the institution is automatically included.

## SECTION 2. - ALTERNATES

Before the City Council adopts the new master plan for Swedish Medical Center's Cherry Hill Campus, vacancies that may occur among the voting members of the Citizens Advisory Committee may be filled by the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods without City Council confirmation, provided that such appointments:

- a) Do not increase the size of the Advisory Committee above 12 members;
- b) Do not substantially alter the balance of the interests, expertise, and experiences represented on the Advisory Committee; and
- c) Except for a vacancy occurring for the member serving as the non-management representative of Swedish Medical Center Cherry Hill Campus, are selected from the list

of alternates shown below, unless and until all persons on that list are either unable or unwilling to be appointed.

When appointing from the list of alternates below, the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods shall appoint the available person whose skills and affiliations most closely match those of the resigning member.

Alternates shall participate in all regular meetings of the Committee and vote in the absence of any regular member. The by-laws of the Committee shall identify a procedure for members to identify their preferred alternate.

In the event that all alternates identified below have been appointed as regular members, and prior to the issuance of the final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS), additional vacancies may be filled by the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods without City Council confirmation, provided that such appointments:

- a) Do not increase the size of the Advisory Committee above 12 members; and
- b) Do not substantially alter the balance of the interests, expertise, and experiences represented on the Advisory Committee.

In making such appointments the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods will consult closely with Swedish Medical Center.

Following publication of the Final EIS and Final Master Plan, vacancies may be filled only by those alternates who are identified below and in the event that none are available the position shall remain vacant.

**SECTION 3 – EX-OFFICIO MEMBERS**

Four non-voting ex-officio members of the Citizens Advisory Committee shall represent Swedish Medical Center, the Department of Neighborhoods, the Department of Planning and Development, and the Seattle Department of Transportation.

The initial voting members listed in Section 1 above (or alternates appointed pursuant to Section 2) shall serve an initial term that expires upon City Council adoption of the new master plan for Swedish Medical Center’s Cherry Hill Campus.

**SECTION 4 – APPOINTMENTS TO THE STANDING ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

Following adoption by the City Council of a new master plan for Swedish Medical Center’s Cherry Hill Campus, a standing advisory committee shall be established. Both in the initial convening of that committee and the filling of subsequent vacancies on it, (1) the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods may appoint or reappoint voting members to serve any number of additional, renewable, two-year terms upon agreement of Swedish Medical Center and without additional City Council re-confirmation; and (2) vacancies among voting members (including but not limited to vacancies that occur as a result of the failure of the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods and Swedish Medical Center to mutually agree upon appointment or reappointment for any position), may be filled by the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods without City Council confirmation, provided that such appointments:



- a) Do not increase the size of the Advisory Committee above 12 members; and
- b) Do not substantially alter the balance of the interests, expertise, and experiences represented on the Advisory Committee.

SECTION 5 – STAFFING

The Citizens Advisory Committee shall be staffed by the Department of Neighborhoods with the cooperation and assistance of Swedish Medical Center. Technical assistance to the Committee shall be provided by the Department of Planning and Development, the Department of Neighborhoods and the Seattle Department of Transportation.

**Legislation Title:**

A RESOLUTION approving the composition of the Major Institution Citizens Advisory Committee for Swedish Medical Center's Cherry Hill Campus.

**Summary of the Legislation:**

The resolution authorizes the final composition of a Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) for Swedish Medical Center's Cherry Hill Campus through a Memorandum of Agreement with the institution, prepared by the Department of Neighborhoods (DON).

**Background:**

The City's Land Use Code Chapter 23.69, Major Institutions Overlay District, establishes a process for authorizing and regulating the growth of Seattle's major institutions, particularly its hospitals, universities, or community colleges. This Code requires that an institution, in consultation with the Director of the DON, recruit potential appointees to a CAC composed of representatives of the local community and others directly affected by the actions of the institution. The Executive is authorized to recommend to the Council individuals to achieve a balanced, independent and representative committee.

Swedish Medical Center informed the City of its intent to complete a master plan for its Cherry Hill Campus, and in consultation with the City, recommended a list of members for its CAC. The Executive reviewed and modified that list and is recommending a final list to the Council for approval.

Dear Council President Clark:

I am pleased to transmit the attached Resolution that states the City Council's approval of the final composition of the Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) for Swedish Medical Center's Cherry Hill Campus.

The City's Land Use Code Chapter 23.69, Major Institutions Overlay District, establishes a process for authorizing and regulating the growth of Seattle's major institutions. This Code requires that an institution, in consultation with the Director of the Department of Neighborhoods, recruit potential appointees to a Citizens Action Committee composed of representatives of the local community and others directly affected by the actions of the institution. The Executive is authorized to recommend to the Council individuals who would achieve a balanced, independent, and representative committee.

Swedish Medical Center informed the City of its intent to complete a master plan for its Cherry Hill (Old Providence) campus and recommended a list of members for the CAC. After reviewing and modifying Swedish's list, I am recommending the establishment of a committee of 12 members in order to allow a fuller and more representative range of voices to participate. The Code specifies that the Council may change the size and composition of the committee.

Upon reviewing the structure of this committee, my staff determined that no suggested member has a direct economic relationship with Swedish Medical Center, except the non-management representative, and that the recommended membership would constitute a balanced, representative, and independent committee. I therefore respectfully request that the City Council approve the Citizens Advisory Committee as recommended.



