3 A RESOLUTION appointing two members to the Seattle-King County Taxicab Advisory
4 Commission to advise and make recommendations on taxicab regulations to the City of
5 Seattle and King County.

6 WHEREAS, in November 2009 Ordinance 123131 created the Seattle-King County Taxicab
7 Advisory Commission; and

8 WHEREAS, the legislation was amended by Ordinance 123333 in July 2010; and

9 WHEREAS, the enabling ordinances stated that five positions must be appointed by King
10 County and five by the City of Seattle, of which three are appointed by the City Council
11 and two are appointed by the Mayor, and

12 WHEREAS, the enabling ordinances require the City Council's appointments be made by
13 resolution; and

14 WHEREAS, the Seattle City Council appoints members to positions five, seven, and nine and
15 the Mayor appoints positions three and one; and

16 WHEREAS, positions five and nine are currently vacant; NOW, THEREFORE,

17 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE THAT:**

18 Section 1. The City Council appoints the following two individuals to serve on the
19 Seattle-King County Taxicab Advisory Commission:

20 1. Jerri Lane (Position #5 – Hospitality Industry Representative), to a term of
21 confirmation to June 30, 2015.

22 2. Jagjit Singh (Position #9 – Taxicab Driver Representative), to a term of confirmation
23 to June 30, 2013.

Legislation Title: A RESOLUTION appointing two members to the Seattle-King County Taxicab Advisory Commission to advise and make recommendations on taxicab regulations to the City of Seattle and King County.

Summary of the Legislation:

This legislation makes two appointments to the Seattle-King County Taxicab Advisory Commission:

1. Jerri Lane (Position #5 – Hospitality Industry Representative), to a term of confirmation lasting until June 30, 2015.
2. Jagjit Singh (Position #9 – Taxicab Driver Representative), to a term of confirmation lasting until June 30, 2013.

Background:

The Seattle-King County Taxicab Advisory Commission has 11 members. Five are appointed by King County and five by the City of Seattle. Three City appointments are required to be made by Council resolution and two are appointed by the Mayor. Commission members represent various segments of the taxicab industry and different customer groups.


