WHEREAS, if passed, Initiative 1401 will strengthen Washington's laws against trafficking in products derived from ten iconic and threatened animal species or groups of species (elephants, rhinos, lions, tigers, cheetahs, leopards, pangolins, marine turtles, sharks, and rays);

12 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Seattle to promote ethical trade practices
13 within the city, region, and state; and

14 WHEREAS, this animal protection initiative has been drafted in consultation with animal
15 conservation experts to ensure it will be effective in protecting endangered animals
16 without harming ordinary citizens who legitimately own items that include products
17 derived from these animals; and

18 WHEREAS, a limited, carefully considered list of exemptions included in this initiative covers
19 antiques, museums, items used for scientific and educational purposes, family heirlooms,
20 and musical instruments; and

21 WHEREAS, it is important and proper for the Seattle City Council to formally express its
22 position through resolution on issues that come before the electorate in the State of
23 Washington that could impact the City of Seattle; NOW, THEREFORE,

24 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THE**
25 **MAYOR CONCURRING, THAT:**

1 Section 1. The Seattle City Council endorses Washington Animal Trafficking, Initiative
2 1401 (2015).





