**Budget Action description:**

This green sheet would add \$250,000 to SDOT’s 2012 budget to lead an interdepartmental team to update the Seattle Bicycle Master Plan. Seattle’s Bicycle Master Plan (Plan) was adopted in 2007, which called for a 5-year update. It is Council’s intent that new tools for safer bicycling such as neighborhood greenways and cycle tracks be assessed and planned for in the update. This green sheet would also impose a budget proviso.

With the goal of creating complete streets that are safe and enjoyable, the interdepartmental team should consult with the transportation advisory boards of Seattle including the Seattle Bicycle Advisory Board, the Pedestrian Advisory Board and the Freight Advisory Board. The planning process should review and incorporate best practices from other cities and may include the adoption of the National Association of City Transportation Officials (NACTO) Urban Bikeway Design Guidelines.

The Plan should identify routes appropriate for separated lanes to improve safety, especially in the downtown core. Similarly, the Plan should identify routes appropriate for neighborhood greenways that provide community connections for bicyclists and pedestrians along streets with less automobile traffic. The Plan should also identify how to integrate greenways and cycle-tracks into other networks and infrastructure currently in the Plan. The Plan should also include a process for adoption of an annual prioritized implementation plan with a schedule and funding strategies (similar to the Pedestrian Master Plan).

It is expected that SDOT will provide the Council with a scope of work for review no later than February 1, 2012.

It is expected an additional \$150,000 will be needed in 2013 to complete the update.

This green sheet would also impose the following budget proviso:

“None of the money appropriated in the 2012 budget for the Department of Transportation’s Mobility-Operations BCL may be spent for the Bicycle Master Plan Update until authorized by future ordinance. Council anticipates that such authority will not be granted until the Department of Transportation provides a revised, detailed scope of work for Council review and approval that includes creating a comprehensive plan and strategy for implementation of greenways and cycle-tracks.”
