1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to City streets; changing the name of the portion of Thomas St between 1st Ave N and 2nd Ave N to Lenny Wilkens Way; and superseding the relevant portions of Ordinance 4044, Ordinance 89910, Ordinance 102981, and any other ordinance to the extent inconsistent; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

Summary and background of the Legislation: This ordinance would supersede the honorary street name resolved by Council earlier this year (Resolution 32019) with a legal street name change. While a legal street name change can often be costly and burdensome for affected businesses and residents, as well as the City, it became clear during the planning for an unveiling event that a legal street name change would be easily feasible at this location due to the lack of any postal addresses on this segment of Thomas St, because the segment fronts only one easily identifiable landmark, and because the renaming would require replacement of only 3 street signs. These conditions are similar to those present when a segment of Atlantic St alongside the Mariners stadium was renamed Edgar Martinez Dr in 2004 (Ordinance 121612).

This would be one of the few streets in Seattle named after an African-American.
