Notice of Public Comment related to Resolution 31252:

As part of this meeting, the Seattle City Council intends to vote on Resolution No. 31252, "A Resolution stating the City Council's support of the State Referendum Bill No. 52 and urging the voters of the City of Seattle to vote "approved" on the November 2, 2010 general election ballot."

The ballot title of State Referendum Bill No. 52 reads, "The legislature has passed Engrossed House Bill No. 2561, concerning authorizing and funding bonds for energy efficiency projects in schools.

This bill would authorize bonds to finance construction and repair projects increasing energy efficiency in public schools and higher education buildings, and continue the sales tax on bottled water otherwise expiring in 2013. Should this bill be: [] Approved [] Rejected "

Notice of Public Comment related to Resolution 31253:

As part of this meeting, the Seattle City Council intends to vote on Resolution No. 31253, "A Resolution stating the City Council's support of the Seattle Public School District's Proposition 1, a three year School Levy and urging Seattle voters to vote "yes" on Proposition 1 on the November 2, 2010 general election ballot."

The ballot title of Proposition 1 reads, "The Board of Directors of Seattle School District No. 1 passed Resolution No. 2009/10-15 concerning this proposition for supplemental educational program funding. To partially replace reduced State funding and to improve education throughout Seattle Public Schools this proposition authorizes the District to levy the following supplemental taxes on all taxable property within the District, to help the District meet the educational needs of its approximately 45,507 students:
