Check yourself, your family and your home

- ☐ Check yourself and your family members for injuries.
- ☐ Take care of your house by:
 - ☐ Putting out small fires using a portable fire extinguisher.
 - ☐ Turning off your natural gas at the valve outside the house, **only if you smell natural gas, hear or see a problem, or if you suspect a leak.**
 - ☐ Turn off your water at the main house valve and, if necessary, your electricity at the main electrical panel.
- Dress for safety and go to your meeting site:
 - ☐ Wear comfortable clothing, hardhat, safety glasses, gloves, sturdy shoes.
 - ☐ Bring a flashlight and your first aid kit.
 - ☐ Put your fire extinguisher at the end of the driveway for others to use if necessary.


- ☐ Tune in to the radio for up to date information.
- ☐ How to use a Fire Extinguisher: Pull the pin.

Aim at base of fire

Squeeze handle

Sweep from side to side

How and when to turn off gas: If an emergency arises and you don't smell or hear gas escaping, you don't need to shut off gas service. But if you do smell or hear gas: locate the meter shut-off valve. It's usually the first fitting on the gas supply pipe coming out of the ground near your meter.



- ☐ First Aid basics: Check Call Care

 - Control bleeding with direct pressure and elevating.
 - Keep person calm and comfortable.
 - Keep them warm to prevent shock.
 - Don't let people move injured person unless the scene if unsafe.
