[116952](#) Relating to the "Agreement for Sewage Disposal" between the City of Seattle and the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle dated January 26, 1961 and amended by "Supplemental Agreement No. 2" executed February 15, 1962; authorizing the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation to convey easements to King County over and through various park lands in partial satisfaction of City of Seattle obligations under the "Agreement for Sewage Disposal."
