SUBJECT: Mayoral Appointments to the Seattle Human Rights Commission (Get Engaged)

The Human Rights Commission is composed of 16 members seven appointed by the City Council, seven appointed by the Mayor, one Get Engaged member and one appointed by the commission itself. All appointments are subject to City Council confirmation. Attached to this memorandum is the current membership roster of the Human Rights Commission.

Eighteen individuals submitted applications to serve as the *Get Engaged* commissioner on the Seattle Human Rights Commission. Applications and resumes were reviewed by staff at the Seattle Office for Civil Rights and the Get Engaged program staff. Interviews were held with three selected candidates.
