Subject City Council Appointments to Bridging the Gap Oversight Committee

The Bridging the Gap Oversight Committee was established upon voter approval of the BTG property tax levy in November 2006. The advisory body monitors revenues, expenditures, and program and project implementation. The Oversight Committee may advise the City Council, the Mayor, and SDOT on responding to program and project cost savings or shortfalls. In addition, the Oversight Committee reviews SDOT's program and project priorities and financial plans, and makes recommendations to the Mayor and the Council regarding the spending of levy proceeds.. Mayoral and Council appointees serve 4-year terms. Members may be reappointed at the end of their terms.
