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**RESOLUTION** 31262

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A RESOLUTION appointing twelve members to the Citizens' Transportation Advisory Committee III to advise the Council and the Mayor on transportation funding alternatives and priorities.

WHEREAS, the transportation system of Seattle is an extraordinary public asset and is vital and integral to the city's economic health, environmental quality, and social and community fabric; and

WHEREAS, because the prolonged recession and eroding gas-tax receipts have reduced resources available to the City of Seattle, it is not possible to sustain from the City's general fund and capital budget the levels of investment that would be required to preserve and maintain existing infrastructure, enhance bicycle and pedestrian mobility, improve mobility and safety for people with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has established a Seattle Transportation Benefit District (STBD) via Council Bill 116947, passed September 20, 2010, and the STBD has levied a twenty-dollar Vehicle License Fee (VLF) to be implemented no later than May 1, 2011; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 31240, adopted September 20, 2010, established a Citizens' Transportation Advisory Committee III to first develop a proposed project list and spending plan for the anticipated revenues from the twenty-dollar VLF, and then undertake a full review of the City's transportation funding system and transportation needs in the context of evaluating a potential STBD ballot measure asking Seattle voters to fund additional transportation projects; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 31240 provided for the appointment of CTAC III's twelve members; six by the Council and six by the Mayor; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THE MAYOR CONCURRING:

**Legislation Title:** A RESOLUTION appointing twelve members to the Citizens' Transportation Advisory Committee III to advise the Council and the Mayor on transportation funding alternatives and priorities.

**Summary of the Legislation:**

This past September, the City Council established, by Resolution, a Citizens Transportation Advisory Committee III, assigning it two specific sets of tasks: 1) develop a spending plan and project list specific for the use of revenues generated from a \$20 annual vehicle license fee for 2012 and beyond and 2) to examine and review the City's transportation funding structure and make recommendations regarding a potential list of projects as part of a future Seattle Transportation Benefit District ballot measure and other potential funding sources. This legislation names twelve appointees, as called for in the Resolution establishing CTAC III.

**Background:**

Resolution 31240 established CTAC III, and called for a future resolution to appoint a committee made up of 12 members of which six shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Council and six appointed by the City Council. Council Bill 116947 established the Seattle Transportation Benefit District (STBD). The STBD Board of Directors, composed of all nine City Councilmembers, implemented a \$20 annual Vehicle License Fee (VLF) via STBD Resolution 1 (as authorized by RCW 36.73.065), effective no later than May 1, 2011.

Resolution 31240 calls for the CTAC III chair to be selected from among the members by the members and charges the Committee with advising the City and STBD Governing Board (City Council) on prioritizing and funding transportation projects. CTAC III will also undertake a full review of the City's transportation funding system. CTAC III will be jointly staffed by SDOT and Council Central Staff.

Resolution 31240 requests the Committee to submit a project list and spending plan and supporting documentation and analysis to the City Council related to the enacted \$20 annual VLF no later than June 30, 2011. CTAC III recommendations for future spending related to the proposed twenty-dollar annual vehicle license fee revenues will be considered as part of the 2012 budget process and beyond.

In addition, the advisory committee will explore other voter approved revenue options, identify potential projects and develop options for further consideration following a comprehensive review of SDOT's sources of funding.
