

The Chair and Vice-chair are appointed at beginning of each year by the Board. If a member vacates a position before a term expires, the replacement fulfills the unexpired term and, except for Position 1, may apply for subsequent terms.

The Board of Park Commissioners is a seven-member citizen advisory board. Three members are appointed by the Mayor, subject to the City Council's confirmation; three members are appointed by the City Council; and one member is appointed by the Board itself. Commissioners serve three-year terms and remain members of the Board until their replacement has been appointed or confirmed by the City Council.

**Antoinette Angulo**

Antoinette is a bilingual public health practitioner with Sea Mar Community health and lives in Wallingford. She works in the South Park neighborhood and is an advocate for healthy communities for all. Her intent as Park Commissioner would be to focus on the nexus among parks, safety, access, and chronic disease. She has spent five years on the Citywide Review team with the Department of Neighborhoods and is a proponent of food justice and the urban agriculture movement.
