The Puget Sound Regional Council is designated by the federal government and the state as the area's Metropolitan Planning Organization and Regional Transportation Planning Organization. The Regional Council was formed on October 1, 1991, by local governments in the central Puget Sound region as a forum for making key decisions on regional growth and transportation issues. The Council includes King, Kitsap, Pierce and Snohomish counties and cities, an area of 6,400 square miles that is home to over 3.4 million people--more than 55 percent of the people in the State of Washington.

In June 1997, Mary McCumber was selected as the Public Official of the Year by the Municipal League of King County and in 2003 was awarded the Larry Dahms Life Time Achievement Award by the Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations.

Executive Director of a 17-member commission (13 citizens and four legislators) appointed by Governor Booth Gardner. The Growth Strategies Commission was charged with developing recommendations to address the complex issues of growth facing the state of Washington. Based on the Commission's recommendations, landmark growth management legislation was enacted by the 1990 and 1991 sessions of the Legislature.

Responsible for physical planning (long-range and development project review) and social service planning for a rapidly growing King County city. Implemented a new comprehensive plan for the city, which revised the city's zoning, downtown revitalization efforts, environmental protection and urban design planning. Responsible for comprehensive planning and growth monitoring. The Annual Growth Report received the Outstanding Planning Award from the American Planning Association and two State awards.

Also served as the project leader for a revision to the Federal Way Community Plan, with particular emphasis on land use and sewerage service issues.

The Historic Seattle PDA Council is made up of 12 members, four appointed by the Constituency, four appointed by the Council itself, and four appointed by the Mayor. Enabling legislation is Seattle Municipal Code 3.110. All appointments are subject to City Council confirmation. Attached to this memorandum is the current membership roster of the Historic Seattle PDA Council including the new appointees.

The bio for the re-appointee is as follows:

Mary McCumber is a retired urban planner whose background includes extensive work in historic preservation/conservation as well as growth management and transportation planning. She has been a member of Historic Seattle since the late 70's, served on the Historic Seattle Council from 1980 – 1987, and on the City's Landmarks Preservation Board for seven years. In 2003 McCumber rejoined the Historic Seattle Council as a Mayoral appointee, and since that time she has actively participated in many areas, most distinctively as the co-chair of Historic Seattle's new Strategic Plan. Implementation of the goals identified in the Strategic Plan would be a priority for Mary's next term on the Historic Seattle Council.
