PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE:

The Art Affect

Founder and Program Director, Seattle, WA

September 2010-present

- Plan, organize and lead bi-monthly "artSmash!" events for youth and young adults that focus on topics of social justice, utilizing artistic expression as a vehicle for personal transformation and positive social change.
- Work in collaboration with a team of committed volunteers - including several youth - to plan meetings, host youth arts showcase events and engage young people throughout the city in artistic expression and social activism.
- Collaborating with the Youth Change Activist Network to host the 2011 King County Youth Summit in March and with Seattle Green Festival to host a 2-day youth arts showcase in May
- Manage a Facebook page with over 300 fans, manage and update the program's website, design and distribute email newsletters to database of over 350 people, build and manage relationships with funders, partners and volunteers
- Secured in-kind donations and over \$12,000 in preliminary grant funding to develop the program
- Directly impacted over 200 youth and young adults through our programming over the past 6 months
- Personally volunteered over 500 hours working to launch the program over the past 6 months

City of Seattle's Neighborhood Matching Fund

Grant Recipient and Project Coordinator – Art4Justice, Seattle, WA

November 2009-June 2010

- Independently secured \$13,800 from the *Neighborhood Matching Fund*, matched by \$15,000 of in-kind donations from community organizations, to host two community arts events focusing on social, economic and environmental justice
- Supervised a team of 7 youth (ages 15-18) to plan and host our two Art4Justice events that engaged over 300 community members and featured youth performances and artwork promoting social justice
- Empowered 60 youth artists from across the city to utilize their creative expression as a catalyst for social change
- Facilitated weekly planning meetings, led training sessions, planned and executed promotional campaign, planned and executed two large events with over 150 people in attendance at each, developed online marketing tools including a Facebook page with over 600 fans, provided opportunities for youth leadership and professional development, managed guest artist contracts and helped to manage project expenses and oversee budget, completed all aspects of grant reporting on time and above and beyond what was expected
- Strengthened the community by building relationships between youth activists and non-profit organizations

- Assisted student-led environmental clubs to plan and direct youth leadership events and service learning projects
- Led social media campaign and assisted with advertising and promotional materials

- Facilitated environmental workshops, fostered regional collaborations and independently hosted youth leadership events
