The Oversight Committee shall consist of fifteen (15) members: a City Council member (the Chair of the City Council's Transportation Committee or its successor committee with responsibility for transportation), the City Director of Finance, one representative each chosen by and from among the respective members of the Seattle Pedestrian Advisory Board, Seattle Bicycle Advisory Board and Seattle Freight Advisory Committee, five (5) Seattle residents appointed by the City Council and five (5) Seattle residents appointed by the Mayor. Attached to this memorandum is the current membership roster of the Bridging the Gap Levy Oversight Committee including the new appointees.

The appointments' bios for all new appointees are as follows:

**David R. Hiller** joined the Cascade Bicycle Club in 2003 and serves as the Advocacy Director. Since his arrival, the Club has grown into the largest non-motorized policy, advocacy and education organization in North America. Leading numerous successful projects and campaigns, he has established Cascade as a regional force.

David has served as the Executive Director of the Connecticut Bicycle Coalition, the Development Director for the Long Island Soundkeeper Fund and an organizer for social justice in Los Angeles California. In 2007 David was nominated for a Political Genius award by The Stranger newspaper.

Renee A. Staton has volunteered countless hours over the years on pedestrian and transportation safety issues and with local urban mobility organizations. Renee served on the Seattle Neighborhood Planning Advisory Committee, was a founder of the Friends of Jackson Park Trail, a co-founder of the Friends of Pinehurst Playfield, a board member of Great City and a member of the St. Catherine School Finance Council.

She is currently a board member of Earshot Jazz and a member of the Pinehurst Community Council where she lives with her family.
