The Public is invited to attend a public hearing to discuss the community and economic development needs of Seattle and how they should be reflected in the proposed 2012 Update to the Consolidated Plan, at the Housing, Human Services, Health and Culture Committee meeting of the Seattle City Council on:

The 2012 Update includes proposed uses of approximately:

- \$10.8 million in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG);
- \$ 4.6 million in HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME);
- \$735,068 in Emergency Shelter Grant Program (ESG); and
- \$1.7 million in Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA).

The adoption of the proposed 2012 Update has significant impact on City services and programs supported by the federal funds listed above because the anticipated allocations represent a decrease in funding for three of the four Consolidated Plan funds.

Submittal of a Consolidated Plan and annual updates is a federal requirement to receive these funds. The Consolidated Plan is intended to outline the City's strategies to address the housing and community development needs of the City's low and moderate-income residents.

The 2012 draft Update of the Consolidated Plan will be available for public review starting September 20, 2011.
