

## DWLS 3°


The most common reason for DWLS 3° filings is the failure of offenders to pay traffic infraction fines.


# Seattle Population by Race

#### DWLS 3° Charges Will Be Filed When:

- Offender needed to furnish proof of treatment of progress in a chemical dependency program (RCW 46.20.342(1)(c)(i))
- Offender failed to comply with provisions in RCW 46.29 regarding uninsured accidents (RCW 46.20.342(1)(c)(iii)
- A suspension due to DWLS-2 that was then eligible to have license re-instated, but did not (RCW 46.20.342(1)(c)(vi))
- The charge was received in connection with a traffic accident
- The charge is a companion to another criminal charge such as hit and run or DUI


## **DWLS 3° Policy**

- First Offense if Not for reasons above
  - No Charges Filed

- Second Offense if Not for reasons above
  - No Valid Operator License (NOVL) infraction
  - \$550 Penalty (SMC 11.20.010(B))

- Third Offense
  - Charged with the misdemeanor crime of DWLS 3°


#### **DWLS 3° CASES FILED**


#### **NEW DWLS 3° POLICY**




