ORDINANCE _____

COUNCIL BILL 117564

AN ORDINANCE relating to a grant from the United States Department of Transportation for the construction of the Mercer Corridor Project West Phase; authorizing the Director of Transportation to accept a \$14,000,000 grant and to execute grant-related agreements for and on behalf of the City; and ratifying and confirming prior acts.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) has authorized \$500,000,000 for the Fiscal Year 2012 Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) grant program; and

WHEREAS, The City of Seattle submitted an application to the USDOT in May 2012 to request funds through this program for the purpose of constructing the Mercer Corridor Project West Phase; and

WHEREAS, based on the City's successful application, USDOT has awarded \$14,000,000 to the City from these funds; and

WHEREAS, the TIGER grant requires execution of a grant agreement; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Director of Transportation ("Director") or his designee is authorized to accept a grant from the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) under its Fiscal Year 2012 Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) grant program, in the amount of \$14,000,000, and to execute, deliver and perform, on behalf of The City of Seattle, agreements with the United States and with Washington Department of Transportation for the purpose of accepting the grant funding for construction of the Mercer Corridor Project West Phase. The grant funds, when received, shall be deposited in the receiving fund identified below.

Section 2. Any acts consistent with the authority of the ordinance taken after its passage and prior to its effective date is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to a grant from the United States Department of Transportation for the construction of the Mercer Corridor Project West Phase; authorizing the Director of Transportation to accept a \$14,000,000 grant and to execute grant-related agreements for and on behalf of the City; and ratifying and confirming prior acts.

Summary and background of the Legislation: This legislation authorizes the acceptance of grant funds made available through the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) TIGER program.

The USDOT has awarded \$14,000,000 to the City of Seattle from the Fiscal Year 2012 Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) grant program. The grant funds will be used for the purpose of constructing the Mercer Corridor Project West Phase. The grant requires a minimum 20% local match.

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Council Bill that accepts a \$14,000,000 grant from the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) for the construction of the Mercer Corridor Project West Phase.

The project is currently at 100% design with an updated cost estimate of approximately \$95 million. With the recent award of the TIGER IV grant, the project is fully funded. The project will improve local safety, access, and circulation within the neighborhood for motorized vehicles, bicycles, and pedestrians and provide for more direct movement of traffic and freight through the Mercer Corridor in South Lake Union and Uptown to prepare the City to meet the anticipated growth of the communities.
