Program Overview

- \$20 million DOE Better Buildings grant
- Neighborhood-based program to achieve deep energy savings and create jobs
- Program Goals:
 - Drive demand for energy efficiency in six building sectors
 - Create and retain living wage green jobs
 - Achieve 15% to 45% in energy savings per building retrofitted



2012 Changes

CPW is bigger, more efficient, and moving forward

- CPW target area expanded to cover all of Seattle
 - February 1st Press Release
 - CPW Media Event
- CPW for Home
 - Simplified rebate structure
 - Reallocated revolving loan funds to rebates
 - New interest rates, opening loan pool
 - Four new contractors
- CPW for Hospital
 - Increased incentives
- Partnership with HomeWise






Community Power Works

Stage*	Homeowners
Applied for Program	955
Received/Scheduled Home Energy Assessment	732
Upgrades Completed/In Progress	125

Other Program Updates

CPW will surpass non-residential goals by over 200% with current project pipeline

Large Commercial

- WAC under construction, IBM Tower and Rainier Tower approved
- 1.5 million square feet, \$2.5 million of public/private investment
- Other buildings being audited

Small Business

- Launched: August 2011
- 215 businesses contacted, 43 requested energy assessment, 26 assessments completed, 9 bids requested, 1 bid completed





Other Program Updates

Hospitals (Group Health, Harborview, Swedish, Virginia Mason)

- Strategic Energy Management Plans (SEMPs) completed.
- \$3.2 million of projects under construction

Multifamily

- Partnership with HomeWise
- 145 units completed, 366 in preparation
- On track to meet unit goal of 600

Workforce

- 20,000 hours worked with 226 people collecting paychecks because of CPW
