Professional Experience

Erin Slayton, a licensed civil engineer, has experience doing civil design and large scale site planning. She is also an experienced program manager, and coordinates well with the public as well as other agency stakeholders. Having worked for both the private and public sectors, Erin offers her ability to integrate technical, problem-solving, and communications skills. Erin is a strong communicator and is often called on to give technical presentations to peer groups as well as community organizations. Erin has a Masters Degree in Structural Engineering from the University of Washington where she explored seismic design and advanced topics in steel and prestressed concrete design.

HDR Project Experience

Washington State Dept. of Transportation, SR 520 I-5 to Medina Bridge Replacement and HOV Project. Project Manager. Erin led a multi-disciplinary team in developing content for a Request for Proposal for an \$700 million portion of the project to replace the world's longest floating bridge. Erin has also served as WSDOT's representative to coordinate the Montlake Triangle Project, which involved developing agreements and coordinating with four other agencies. Erin manages the design team on a segment of the multi-billion dollar Westside work, and supports WSDOT with strategy and delivery. (2010 to present)

Washington State Dept. of Transportation, SR 520 Bridge Replacement and HOV GEC, Seattle, WA. Project Manager, Advanced Construction Methods, Engineering for pontoons Project (ACME) and Noise Mitigation Team Leader. The ACME project involves innovative pontoon tests to examine various pontoon construction methods and techniques. Erin leads a multi-disciplinary, multi-organization team to complete the fast-track project. Erin is responsible for managing the budget and schedule for the project. Erin also oversees consultant agreements and the preparation of the PS&E package. (2009 to present)

In addition, Erin served as the Project Engineer for the I-5 Noise Mitigation Team. She led an integrated team of 8 people working on 3 WSDOT noise projects (I-5 Ship Canal Bridge, I-5 / 5th Ave. NE to NE 92nd St. - Noise Wall and I-5 Boston to Shelby Noise Wall). In addition to being the Engineer of Record for the 5th to 92nd project, Erin was responsible for staff planning and managing the budgets and schedules of the noise projects. Erin also oversaw consultant agreements and the

preparation of PS&E packages. (2004 to 2009)

She performed construction support services, including responding to RFIs, and coordinating with contractors/owners to resolve design issues during construction. Her coordination with project owners and contractors included obtaining project permits and agency approvals. (2001 to 2002)

Obayashi Corp., Civil Engineering Research - Obayashi Technical Research Institute, Kiyose, Japan. Engineering Research Intern. Erin translated, reviewed and revised Japanese engineering reports which involved prior training to develop a working knowledge of Japanese. Her other responsibilities included constructing a scaled model of a centrifuge, developing spreadsheets to analyze research data from various civil engineering experiments including seismic isolation techniques, concrete mix design, and soil compaction. Erin was assigned to work as the field engineer for a tunnel boring project. (1999)

This project involved coordinating with subcontractors as prime contractor for an urban redevelopment project. Seattle Popular Monorail Authority, Seattle Monorail Project, Seattle, WA. Segment Management. Erin monitored and tracked consultant deliverables and provided technical management for a 5 mile segment of the 14 mile, \$1.6 billion project. As the agency lead for the Bridge Technical Design Committee, Erin's responsibilities involved collaborating with project stakeholders from local, state, and federal agencies. She provided management oversight of the preliminary design of a 600 foot long monorail-only bridge over the Lake Washington Ship Canal and supported permitting efforts through plan development and technical narrative preparation. Erin monitored an exploratory boring program for the entire 14 mile line, reviewed geotechnical reports for accuracy, and determined implications of laboratory testing results. Erin's other tasks included collaborating with other engineers to select alignment routes using geometric analysis and evaluation of other technical criteria. She developed design specifications for the Design-Build-Operate-Maintain (DBOM) RFP, responded to RFIs, reviewed DBOM proposal, and participated in negotiations with the contractor on technical requirements. (2003 to 2005)

Washington State Dept. of Transportation, Bridge Inspection - Tacoma Narrows Bridge, Tacoma, WA. Bridge Inspection Intern. This project involved reviewing inspection procedures for the Tacoma Narrows Bridge. Erin's responsibilities included inspecting elements of the existing roadway deck and cable suspension systems and analyzing findings of inspection to help develop renewal and replacement plan for the existing bridge and a new parallel bridge. Erin's other tasks involved disseminating information to the public regarding inspection procedures and results via a webpage and presentations. (1998 to 2000)
