



**barkley ridge – f and m development**

The Barkley Ridge Apartments were financed with Low Income Housing Tax Credits and Tax-exempt and Taxable bonds. The apartments consists of 112 units and a lot of on-site amenities that supports a quality lifestyle for low-income families. The design and construction were complicated due to the construction of a 10,000 sq ft water retention vault which sits underneath a building, a complex force sewer main system and wetland buffer encroachment allowing for an additional 12 units of housing.


**bella on broadway – f and m development**

Bella on Broadway is located in the heart of Tacoma's downtown historic district, offering panoramic views of Commencement Bay and Mount Rainier. Bella is a market rate, mid-rise complex consisting of five stories of living over two stories of parking. Bella includes 100 apartment homes consisting of studio, one and two bedroom units. Every unit has a ceiling height of 9', expansive windows and painted millwork. Amenities include a community space which has a fireplace lounge adjacent to a small kitchen, 24 hour fitness facility, year-round indoor spa, business center, theater and outdoor garden patio

# coronado springs – f and m development (construction management)

The redevelopment of Coronado Springs was a partnership between private sponsors and the King County Housing Authority. Utilizing Low Income Housing Tax Credits, Tax-exempt bonds, Taxable bonds, and a low interest energy loan, the sponsors were successful in acquiring the property and completing a very complex physical transformation of the project while the project was occupied. The remodel consisted of installing EIFS at the exterior of the nine story brick tower, photometric light design for exterior walkways and a complete exterior and interior makeover of the property. It now also includes a community center where adult education and and profession-counseling classes are held. The property, which had become notorious in the neighborhood as a haven for drug and criminal activity, is now a model for change in the community. Coronado Springs is a 332-unit complex located just minutes from downtown Seattle.




Completely updated the interior and exterior of a 100-year old house in the Queen Anne neighborhood. The cottage look was preserved on the exterior but with modern clean details. The attic was gutted and redone as an open loft with a new bathroom added. The main floor was update with clean and simple modern details and accents and original flooring was preserved throughout the house. All construction waste was recycled or donated to be reused with only the bare minimum going to the dump. Low VOC paints were used through out and all design details were done to be very simple and cost effective.





Completely updated a 70-year old 1,700 sf, 2-bedroom, 1-bath house into a 2,500 sf, 4-bedroom, 3-1/2 bath with laundry room upstairs, and in the basement a wine cellar, den with a guest suite. Extra windows where added in the basement along the south wall to let in lots of sunshine and open up the space. They wanted to preserve the original Tudor look with some clean modern lines. 90% of the construction debris was recycled, low VOC paints used and recycled doors, knobs where used in the house.
