Catherine Benotto directs Weber Thompson's Community/Urban Design and Landscape Departments. As an Architect, Landscape Architect and Master Planner, Ms. Benotto brings a thorough understanding of built form, ecology, urban design and planning processes, providing balanced, sensitive and sustainable solutions.

Catherine's role on planning projects is Principal in Charge and Lead Designer. She oversees the entire project, ensuring best practices in process, procedures, communications and quality control. She also leads the design of the project.

Throughout her career, she has been recognized for several of her projects, most notably for the design of Jerusalem's City Hall Square in Israel, while working with AJ Diamond Donald Schmitt and Company in Toronto. Ms. Benotto headed the landscape design team on this master plan where the garden spaces tie this civic campus of 13 buildings together and to the heart of Jerusalem. These public spaces included the main civic plaza, amphitheater, aqueduct water feature, roof garden, landscape structures, a City park, courtyards, streetscapes, site lighting and bus shelter design.

Catherine performs extensive public service and advocacy for sustainable site strategies, Low Impact Design and LEED for Neighborhood Development. She serves on the Seattle Planning Commission and is the former chairman of the City of Seattle Design Review Board for West Seattle. She is also a LEED Accredited Professional and leads Weber Thompson Sustainability Team.





