KIP TOKUDA

Kip Tokuda is a lifelong resident of Seattle's central and southeast districts. Mr. Tokuda is retired. Prior to retirement, Mr. Tokuda served as Interim Director of the City of Seattle's Human Services Department (2010 – 2011), worked in HSD's Family and Youth Services Division, and was a member of the national Prevent Child Abuse America (PCA) Board of Directors.

Mr. Tokuda served eight years (1994-2002) in the Washington State House of Representatives, representing the 37th legislative district in Central/Southeast Seattle. He served as the Chair of the House Children and Family Services Committee as well as a member of the House Appropriations and the House Juvenile Justice and Family Law Committees.

In his role as a State representative, Mr. Tokuda acted as a strong advocate for children, individuals with developmental disabilities, and working families. He successfully passed a "Special Needs Adoption" bill designed to meet the needs of disabled children who are adopted through the State; proved instrumental in passing the "Homeless Children's Lawsuit" bill, which provided services for over 60,000 homeless families with children in Washington; and contributed to passage of the "Foster Care Quality and Accountability" bill.

Prior to his terms in the legislature, Mr. Tokuda served as the Executive Director of the State's Washington Council for the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect. In that capacity, he led the charge to develop policies, raise awareness, and advocate on behalf of children and families in Washington.

Mr. Tokuda is married with two daughters. This is Mr. Tokuda's first appointment.

Washington State Legislature
Served four terms (8 years) in the House of Representatives for the 37th legislative district. Served as Chair of the Children and Family Committee in addition to the Appropriations, Transportation, and Criminal Justice Committees. Included in Representative Tokuda's list of accomplishments was the passage of legislation to educate Washington residents on the Japanese experience during World War II, including the internment of 110 Japanese living on the West Coast

into concentration camps and the enlistment of many Japanese Americans in the 442 Regiment and the Military Intelligence Service (MIS). Representative Tokuda prime sponsored a resolution recognizing the Day of Remembrance and acknowledging the contributions of Japanese Americans.

Washington Council for Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect. Appointed by Governor Booth Gardner to lead a statewide agency charged with funding and monitoring programs statewide, to raise public awareness, and to develop and advocate for policies intended to prevent harm to children.

- Principle agency advocate leading to passage of several legislative initiatives including a parenting bill and family support bill.
- Principle advocate for cultural heritage bill.
- Key speaker at numerous conferences relating to child abuse prevention.

- Successfully completed a Sunset Review Process with the Legislative Review Committee and established the Council as a permanent free-standing agency.
