COUNCIL BILL 117633

AN ORDINANCE authorizing, in 2012, acceptance of funding from non-City sources; authorizing the heads of the Office of Sustainability and Environment, the Seattle Fire Department, and the Seattle Police Department to accept specified grants and private funding and to execute, deliver, and perform corresponding agreements; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Director of the Office of Sustainability and Environment, the Fire Chief, and the Chief of Police are authorized to accept the following non-City funding from the grantors listed below, and to execute, deliver, and perform on behalf of The City of Seattle, agreements for the purposes described below. The funds, when received, shall be deposited in the receiving fund identified below to support, or as reimbursement for, the corresponding appropriations set forth in the ordinance introduced as C.B. 117634.

1.1	Grant acceptance for food systems work (Office of Sustainability and Environment, General Subfund (00100))	\$50,000
	<p>This item increases support to the Office of Sustainability & Environment by \$50,000 as a portion of a grant from the Seattle Foundation, in partnership with the Chase Foundation. The grant will enable the City to evaluate opportunities to increase healthy food affordability for low income residents and to explore economic opportunities in the food system. The work funded by this grant will complement the work already being done by OSE to develop and implement the City's Food Action Plan. The entire grant is for \$125,000 of which \$75,000 was accepted in 2nd quarter 2012 supplemental legislation. This acceptance of the remaining \$50,000 completes the grant from the Seattle Foundation and will be used to fund professional services for an economic opportunity gap analysis (\$27,000) and to cover a portion of the OSE Food Policy Advisor's time (\$23,000). The grant period is from August 1, 2012 to December 31, 2013. The grant does not require a match.</p>	
1.2	Collection of air samples for bio toxin screening for emergency response. (Seattle Fire Department, General Subfund (00100))	\$685,743
	<p>This item increases support to the Grants & Reimbursables BCL by \$685,743 from the Federal Department of Homeland Security. Grant funds provide for the 24/7 collection of air samples throughout Seattle to test for the presence of bio toxins. There are thirteen fixed sites with air collecting kiosks as well as one mobile, truck mountable unit, which can be used at large public gatherings such as community festivals and sporting events. Samples are collected by a contracted environmental engineering firm and subsequently delivered to the State of Washington's Department of Health laboratory for testing. Protocols are in place for detection and response in the event of a positive test. This effort is envisioned to be the first link in the chain of an early detection system. No additional positions are created by this grant and there is no local match requirement.</p>	
1.3	Purchase of interoperable emergency radios. (Seattle Fire Department, General Subfund (00100))	\$226,130
	<p>This item increases support to the Grants & Reimbursables BCL in the amount of \$226,130 from the Department of Homeland Security's Port Security Grant program. Funds are for the purchase of approximately 45 interoperable 800 MHz radios. There is no local match for this grant and no positions are created.</p>	
1.4	Marine Patrol and response vessel (Seattle Fire Department, General Subfund (00100))	\$2,586,580

	<p>This item provides support for the Grants & Reimbursables BCL in the amount of \$2,586,580 from the Department of Homeland Defense for a rapid response vessel to be used for marine firefighting and for marine terrorism response (MTR). It allows for the rapid deployment of firefighters to go on board vessels involved in an emergency incident. In addition to deployment of personnel, the vessel will also dispatch needed supplies and equipment to support incident response. It will also be used for evacuation purposes of the injured as well as the rotation of firefighters at the marine incident with reinforcements on shore. No additional positions are needed and there is no local match requirement. This grant is funded through the DHS Port Security Grant Program.</p>	
1.5	<p>Rescue equipment. (Seattle Fire Department, General Subfund (00100))</p> <p>This item increases support for the Grants & Reimbursables BCL in the amount of \$58,062 from the Department of Homeland Defense and administered regionally by King County. This funding from the State Homeland Security Program is for the purchase of chain saws for all ladder and other search and rescue teams. There is no matching fund requirement and no positions are created by this grant.</p>	\$58,062
1.6	<p>Increase to Urban Areas Security Initiative for FFY11 (Seattle Police Department, General Subfund (00100))</p> <p>This item increases support to in the Chief of Police BCL by \$200,000. This grant is from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and Federal Emergency Management Agency under the Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) for the 2011 federal fiscal year. The existing UASI contract between SPD and the Washington State Military Department was amended to increase funding for the purchase, test and install of the AFIS Facial Recognition System project to support the investigative needs of detectives and officers of county and municipal agencies. The amendment does not extend the term of this grant, which runs through May 31, 2014. The project will also receive funding under UASI FFY12. There are no matching requirements or capital improvement projects associated with this item.</p>	\$200,000
1.7	<p>Recreational Boating Safety Grant (Seattle Police Department, General Subfund (00100))</p> <p>This item increases support for the Chief of Police BCL by \$65,262 from the Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission. This funding supports the cost of increased boater education and enforcement efforts by SPD Harbor Unit to conduct supplemental water patrols and vessel inspections and to emphasize enforcement of life jacket requirements, mandatory boater education, and boating under the influence. The term of this grant runs from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. There are no matching requirements or capital improvement projects associated with this item.</p>	\$65,262
