This initially saved the Owner, Hapsmith Development Corp, \$500K in sales tax. It also eliminated any future maintenance costs and accident liability insurance premiums. Early in planning, the City bridge standards were identified. Then independent design review (by WSDOT Bridge & Structures) and inspection services were carefully documented to demonstrate that these standards were met, thereby satisfying fire, police, maintenance, and engineering departments.

**ROW ACQUISITION:** Effectively managed Right of Way acquisition under threat of condemnation meeting target budget and avoiding court battle delays.

**SIGNAGE PROCUREMENT:** Solicited bids and managed construction of city street and state highway destination signage, including a new sign bridge on SR 167 as part of a comprehensive way-finding and marketing signage program.

**WETLANDS MITIGATION:** Obtained permission from Army Corp of Engineers to fill 1 / 10 acre of wetland and created a mile long bio-swale terminating in man-made drainage ponds and a natural wetland.
