

SUMMARY:

- University of Washington with a bachelor's degree in history. (Followed in early 1970's by a second BA in political science).
- Two years in the Peace Corps in India 1964-1966.
- Three years in the US Army with a tour in Europe and in Viet Nam as a combat infantry officer. Left military service with rank of Captain and a small embedded metal fragment as a souvenir
- 31 years as high school teacher. Involved with both social studies and English departments, stints as department chair and last 15 years team teaching College Prep honors program with an emphasis on history of ideas. I also was involved in coaching track, debate, and soccer over the years. In addition I always insisted on having a group of average or lower achieving academic students each year to balance out my perspective on the current group of kids in any given student population. Retired from teaching in 2001.
- Moved to Capitol Hill from the Eastside in 1999.
- Have flunked retirement 4 times to date. Up to the time of my present half day position at Seattle Volvo I have worked since the third week after my retirement from public education. I was recruited for all of the following positions
- Complete Automotive on Capitol Hill. Sold Land Rover, Jaguar, Audi, Mercedes Benz and Porsche. Have had lifelong hobby of restoring antique and sports cars, thus the offer from the owner who I had known for years and heard that I was retired.
- (B) Cleanscapes asked me to join them in the early set up of their operation in Pioneer Square before they expanded to Portland and San Francisco. As you know Cleanscapes is now one of the major contractors for garbage collection in the City of Seattle.

- I have been manning the reception desk at Seattle Volvo on Pike Street. I receive and disperse all incoming calls and handle various clerical duties along with greeting new customers as they enter the showroom.

ACTIVITIES GERMAIN TO DESIGN REVIEW:

- Served as the general contractor for two residential construction projects when the general contractor, who was a friend, suddenly died as the foundations began to be poured. Worked with City of Bainbridge, County permitting and inspection, all sub-contractors, construction teams, materials orders, design changes, materials acquisition, daily construction supervision, and the money involved. I finished both houses and the landscaping after projects on both houses in 9 months. Both residential structures sold for well over a million dollars each.
- Involved in the restoration of Charleston, South Carolina in the early days of the large scale restoration of Ansonborough and other historical districts in the central Charleston area.
- Decade long member and president for 9 years of a condo building HOA Board at 615 East Pike. I am familiar with all it takes to maintain a commercial/residential building on The Hill.
- Involved for a number of years with the Pike Pine Urban Neighborhood Council and did extensive work on the Pike Pine Overlay and provided not only the photography used as the newest examples of successful projects but worked with a small team on the numerous rewrites of the textual details of the most recent proposals. If have participated in and made presentations to the Seattle City Council on design and land use related issues, most recently the Mayor's Staff regarding the design and re-use East District Police parking lot and refueling station on 12th.
- Representative of PPUNC I have attended numerous Design Review meetings over the years and have earned familiarity with everything from TDR's, FAR's and all sorts of DPD nomenclature.
- Helped to successfully resurrect two moribund community groups that are now back alive and functioning; the Capitol Hill Community Council and the Capitol Hill Chamber of Commerce, of which I am a residential member.
- Participated in various design charrettes and community meetings in the past decade to include South Lake Union, Cal Anderson Park, and the Broadway Light Rail station.
