

Dear Ms. Harper,

I am an Executive Board Officer of Amalgamated Transit Union Local 587 and a Metro driver. I would like to express my interest in serving on the Seattle Freight Advisory Board. For many years I have been involved in transportation policy in Seattle. I am currently serving on the Alaskan Way Viaduct Replacement Project at the request of Ron Posthuma. Transportation projects and planning can benefit greatly from a common sense view of those who operate the large vehicles which navigate Seattle Streets and understand its traffic patterns from first-hand experience. The Metro bus system by design includes almost every arterial in Seattle. I have driven bus routes on virtually all of these arterials for the last twenty-nine years. At the same time, I have served many years as liaison from the Amalgamated Transit Union Local 587 to transit policy boards King County Regional Transit Committee and Sound Transit. I am uniquely able to combine the practical perspective of a professional driver with a comprehensive understanding of transportation planning, in order to bring workable suggestions to the table.

Traffic patterns in Seattle, including for freight, must necessarily take into account the many hundreds of bus trips per day that use Seattle streets. Any type of transportation planning in Seattle requires a transit component, and even the best transit mitigation efforts tend to fall short without a common sense perspective. A case in point is the costly debacle of hour-long travel times on Stewart Street while the transit tunnel was closed for retrofitting. Almost any bus driver could have predicted that mitigation on Third but not on Stewart would cause this problem—but none were consulted. More recently, I attended a meeting to resolve problems due to inadequate planning between the Port and Metro which have resulted in costly truck and bus delays on the lower West Seattle bridge during the Spokane Street Viaduct rebuild. Again, what was missing in the planning process was a perspective from the ground level. I hope you will consider the importance of this perspective on the advisory board.
