ORDINANCE _____

COUNCIL BILL 119722

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City's traffic code; amending subsections 11.50.560 and 11.58.005 of the Seattle Municipal Code to correct numbering errors.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 11.50.560, which section was added to Seattle Municipal Code by Ordinance 123946, is amended as follows:

~~((11.50.560))~~ **11.50.570 Automated traffic safety cameras.**

A. Automated traffic safety cameras may be used to detect one (1) or more of the following: stoplight, railroad crossing or school speed zone violations. Use of automated traffic safety cameras is restricted to the following locations only:

1. Intersections of two (2) arterials with traffic control signals that have yellow change interval durations in accordance with Section 11.50.130, which interval may not be reduced after placement of the cameras;
2. Railroad crossings; and
3. School speed zones.

B. Until June 30, 2013, automated traffic safety cameras may be used to detect speed violations for the purposes of Washington Laws of 2011, chapter 367, section 201(2).

C. Before adding additional automated traffic safety cameras or relocating any existing camera, the City Council must prepare an analysis of the locations within the City where automated traffic safety cameras are proposed to be located. Beginning June 7, 2013, an annual report must be posted on the City's website of the number of traffic accidents that occurred at each location where an automated



1 traffic safety camera is located as well as the number of notices of infraction issued for each camera
2 and any other relevant information deemed appropriate.

3 D. Automated traffic safety cameras may only take pictures of the vehicle and vehicle license
4 plate and only while an infraction is occurring. The picture must not reveal the face of the driver or of
5 passengers in the vehicle. The primary purpose of camera placement is to take pictures of the vehicle
6 and vehicle license plate when an infraction is occurring. Cameras should be installed in a manner that
7 minimizes the impact of camera flash on drivers.

8 E. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all photographs, microphotographs, or electronic
9 images prepared under this section are for the exclusive use of law enforcement in the discharge of
10 duties under this section and are not open to the public and may not be used in a court in a pending
11 action or proceeding unless the action or proceeding relates to a violation under this section. No
12 photograph, microphotograph, or electronic image may be used for any purpose other than enforcement
13 of violations under this section nor retained longer than necessary to enforce this section.

14 F. All locations where an automated traffic safety camera is used must be clearly marked at least
15 thirty (30) days prior to activation of the camera by placing signs in locations that clearly indicate to a
16 driver that he or she is entering a zone where traffic laws are enforced by an automated traffic safety
17 camera. Signs placed in automated traffic safety camera locations after June 7, 2012 must follow the
18 specifications and guidelines under the manual of uniform traffic control devices for streets and
19 highways as adopted by the Washington Department of Transportation under RCW Chapter 47.36.

20 G. The compensation paid to the manufacturer or vendor of automated traffic safety camera
21 equipment used must be based only upon the value of the equipment and services provided or rendered
22 in support of the system, and may not be based upon a portion of the fine or civil penalty imposed or the
23 revenue generated by the equipment.

1 Section 2. Section 11.58.005 of the Seattle Municipal Code, which section was last amended by
2 Ordinance 123946, is amended as follows:

3 **11.58.005 Operating motor vehicle in a negligent manner -- Penalty.**

7 ~~((5.))~~ 6. "Great bodily harm" and "substantial bodily harm" have the same meaning as provided
8 in RCW 9A.04.110.

9 ~~((6.))~~ 7. "Vulnerable user of a public way" means a pedestrian, a person riding an animal or a
10 person operating any of the following on a public way: a farm tractor or implement of husbandry,
11 without an enclosed shell, a bicycle, an electric-assisted bicycle, an electric personal assistive mobility
12 device, a moped, a motor-driven cycle, a motorized foot scooter or a motorcycle.

2 approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days after
3 presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.
