

EMPLOYMENT

2009 - 2010 *Interim Department Director, City of Seattle.*

Appointed by Mayor as Director of City's Human Services Department. Responsible for agency administration which included 330 employees and \$100 million budget from federal, state, and local sources. The Department is responsible for contracting for services to the homeless, for early learning, for aging and the disabled, and for youth development and employment.

2003 - 2009 *Division Director and Policy Director , City of Seattle,
Human Services Department.*

Served as Director of the Children and Family Division within the Department of Human Services. Responsible for providing services in the City of Seattle relating to early learning, youth development and employment, and education. Also served as Policy Director to the Department Director, specifically on legislative and public policy agenda for the department.

1993 - 2002 *State Representative, Washington State Legislature*
Served four terms (8 years) in the House of Representatives for the 37th legislative district. Served as Chair of the Children and Family Committee in addition to the Appropriations, Transportation, and Criminal Justice Committees. Included in Representative Tokuda's list of accomplishments was the passage of legislation to educate Washington residents on the Japanese experience during World War II, including the internment of 110 Japanese living on the West Coast into concentration camps and the enlistment of many Japanese Americans in the 442 Regiment and the Military Intelligence Service (MIS). Representative Tokuda prime sponsored a resolution recognizing the Day of Remembrance and acknowledging the contributions of Japanese Americans.

1986 - 1992 *Executive Director , Washington Council for Prevention of
Child Abuse and Neglect*

Appointed by Governor Booth Gardner to lead a statewide agency charged with funding and monitoring programs statewide, to raise public awareness, and to develop and advocate for policies intended to prevent harm to children.

Accomplishments:

- Increased budget from \$400,000 to \$1.2 million.

- Principle agency advocate leading to passage of several legislative initiatives including a parenting bill and family support bill.
- Principle advocate for cultural heritage bill.
- Key speaker at numerous conferences relating to child abuse prevention.
- Lead the strategic planning process for 91-92 biennial period.
- Successfully completed a Sunset Review Process with the Legislative Review Committee and established the Council as a permanent free-standing agency.
