

SELECT PROJECT EXPERIENCE

Jimi Hendrix Park – Seattle

I am currently working with the Friends of Jimi Hendrix Park and Northwest African American Museum, on redeveloping this 5.8 acre park to become a landmark space for Seattle and neighborhood destination for Seattle's Central District. Envisioned as a celebration of Hendrix's enduring legacy, the park's design draws reference to his Seattle roots and pays homage to his music, poetry, art, visionary style, and philosophy through interactive elements and sculptural installations. Located adjacent to NAAM, the park is expected to serve as an iconic platform for innovative educational programming connecting youth to the cultural arts.

Nathan Hale High School - Seattle

I served as a landscape architect and project manager for the modernization of Nathan Hale High School along with Mahlum Architects. We provided a phased approach including the design of several courtyards, building entries, integrated rain garden with new library expansion and re-vegetation along Thornton Creek.

Project 180, Oklahoma City Streetscapes - Oklahoma City

As part of a team led by the Office of James Burnett, I coordinated the design and planning of the streetscape improvements for 36 blocks of downtown Oklahoma City. The endeavor is part of an ambitious plan to accommodate the growth of the downtown core. The entire 180 acre area is being re-imagined with pedestrian comfort and bicycle access in mind, involving relocation of curbs, parking, crosswalks, street narrowing, extensive tree plantings, and accommodation of potential light rail. Our team with the City to create a unique, creative identity for its downtown with a unified and interesting set of site elements, scaled appropriately to the urban context.

Alley24 – Seattle

I worked with NBBJ on the site development for one of the first new mixed use projects in the South Lake Union neighborhood. This full-block project incorporates native plants, green roofs, and alley and

sidewalk plantings. Breaking up the scale of the city block, the project introduces an inviting pedestrian-scale alley while safely allowing for vehicular access through the site. Responding to Thomas Avenue, an adjacent Green Street, plants spill into these midblock pedestrian areas and around the buildings, climb the walls, and fall from the multi-level green roofs and multiple communal roof decks. Working with the existing Landmarked Richmond Laundry Building, the block includes commercial, office, retail, and residential uses in a pedestrian scale manner.

Horizon House – Seattle

I worked as a landscape architect on the expansion of a retirement community on Seattle's First Hill, working with NBBJ and the building resident to design an enhanced streetscape for the benefit of the greater neighborhood, which includes a variety of benches and stone & water features to provide year round perennial color.
