**WORK HISTORY**

July, 2000 to present Senior Services -Seattle, Washington  
**Vice President** Responsible for Aging Your Initiative, advocacy efforts, seven Senior Centers, two Adult Day Health Programs and government/United Way contracts. Previous roles at the agency include: management of volunteer capacity, wellness, nutrition and social work programs and operations including our facility and liability and property insurance. Most Recent Accomplishments: Numerous successful advocacy campaigns to maintain and create new government sources of revenue, creating, implementing and sustaining the Aging Your Way Initiative involving over 1,000 boomer aged adults in King County creating a community that supports successful aging.

Sept, 1996 to July, 2000 Evergreen Health Care – Kirkland, Washington  
**Senior Health Services Supervisor**. Responsible for managing two geriatric health centers providing primary medical care for 2000 older adults along with administering programs for people with chronic conditions. A sampling of programs included: developing high risk case management and disease management programs and outcome measurement systems. Responsibilities included managing all aspects of operations: budgeting, policies and procedures, computer systems, medical equipment, facilities, scheduling, personnel and insuring JCAHO compliance. Accomplishments: Developed senior health centers, diabetes education and disease management programs.

March, 1991 to June, 1996 Milwaukee County Department on Aging - Milwaukee, Wisconsin  
**Long Term Support Division Manager**. Responsible for managing the work of ninety staff, including case managers, supervisors, nursing, paraprofessional and clerical staff serving 8,400 older adults needing community based long term support funding and services. Duties included: Developing programs, managing budgets, writing grant proposals, personnel management, working with unions, managing contracts and insuring compliance with state and federal regulations.

Accomplishments: Played leadership role in a major reorganization of services for older adults in the county, developed specialized units to serve older persons with developmental disabilities and chronic mental illness and redesigned the protective service system for older adults.

- October, 1989 to March, 1991 Milwaukee County Office on Aging - Milwaukee, Wisconsin  
**Long Term Care Coordinator.** Responsible for managing contracts with agencies receiving Older American's Act funding. Duties included: Issuing requests for proposals, evaluation, budgeting, staffing committees and advocacy.  
Accomplishments: Developed program linking community based long term care and hospital service systems to reduce nursing home placement and organized advocacy efforts that lead to new state funding for long term support programs.
- September, 1988 to Oct, 1989 Community Care Organization – Milwaukee, Wisconsin  
**Living-at-Home Program Coordinator.** Responsible for managing foundation funded program that fostered collaboration between formal and informal care systems for older adults. Duties included: Authorizing in-home services, setting up systems for improving coordination of care and reporting to the foundation
- June, 1984 to Sept, 1988 Interfaith Program for the Elderly – Milwaukee, Wisconsin  
**Neighborhood Coordinator.** Started community based program funded by local churches to provide services for older adults living within a geographic region of Milwaukee County. Duties included: Working with a board of directors, publishing a monthly newsletter, recruiting, matching and supervising 65 volunteers, providing information and assistance, conducting assessments, developing care plans, arranging services and providing ongoing case management to older adults.
- January, 1981 to Sept, 1982 Peninsula Project Able – Portland, Oregon  
**Case Manager.** Conducted assessments, developed care plans, arranged services and provided ongoing case management to older adults living in the community.
- August, 1978 to August, 1980 Jesuit Volunteer Corp – Bellingham, WA and Portland, Oregon  
**Community Organizer.** Worked with community activists in Bellingham to address neighborhood concerns related to inadequate sidewalks, lack of green space and traffic. Organized social and recreational programs and recruited volunteers to help older adults in a low income neighborhood in Portland.
